26	Local programs (decentralized approach, community-based, school district boundaries).
3	Tri-sponsored with the school districts, municipalities, and the Circuit Court-Family Division
2	Pronged approach (Casework and Community Organization).
\$1.4M	Local sponsor cash and in-kind contributions.
\$819,100	Additional funds secured by volunteers through grants, donations, and fundraising.
3,806	Families received confidential, family focused, short-term casework services.
1,247	Families received information and referral services.
73/17/6/4	Percent of referrals received from the School (73%), Police (17%), Parent (6%), and Oakland County Prosecutor (4%).
15/10/2/2	Percent of total for four highest offense-related referral reasons: School Incorrigibility (15%), School Truancy (10%), Possession of Marijuana (2%) and Retail Fraud (2%).
62/38	Percent of male/female casework clients.
12.2	Average age of youth referred for casework services.
2,801	Hours of Community Service that Youth Assistance Caseload youth performed.
90%	Success rate for youth receiving YA Casework services. No subsequent contact with Circuit Court. (Based upon a three-year study conducted by MSU (1992)).
700	Volunteers who served as board members, subcommittee members, or task volunteers who planned and implemented prevention programs.
37,616	Number of hours volunteers devoted to Youth Assistance
