Board Healthy Aging Ad Hoc Committee, Area Agency on Aging 1-B open survey to identify gaps in Oakland County senior services

September 28, 2021, OAKLAND COUNTY, MI. – The Oakland County Board of Commissioners Healthy Aging Oakland County Ad Hoc Committee and Area Agency on Aging 1-B (AAA 1-B) are seeking input to identify gaps in services for senior residents through a survey, which will close on October 8, 2021.

“If we’re looking to enhance and expand the delivery of services aimed at supporting seniors and their families, gaining their input is a critical step in the process,” Commissioner **Kristen Nelson** (D-Waterford Twp.), who chairs the committee, said. “This survey will help us identify needs for our aging population so we can support them with the most meaningful, sustainable and impactful services possible.”
