Oakland County Better with Breakfast Year 1, Quarter 2 (April 1, 2019 – June 30, 2019) Summary Report

OVERALL PROGRAM UPDATES:

- Quarter two saw the further expansion of the Oakland County Better with Breakfast initiative which included expanded communication with prospective schools, planning for implementation, and the successful delivery of equipment and materials for those adopting this quarter.
- Together with Oakland Schools, UWSEM hosted another call-in webinar to update prospective schools on our progress and the continued process of adoption and implementation. As the school was winding down, we took this opportunity to communicate with schools that we would be active and available all summer long to focus our efforts on schools ready to launch in the fall.
- Overall, the response to this work has been exceedingly positive. Not only have we had a significant amount of media coverage from our press release and conference, but there has also been an overwhelmingly positive response from the targeted schools themselves. From the onset, schools were raising their hands and opting in. The collaborative nature of this project between 3 high profile entities has elevated the importance of breakfast in schools as well as the speed at which they were willing to implement alternative breakfast models.
- As planned, we have staff in-house working directly with each partner to ensure seamless administration of the program. Notably, UWSEM and Oakland Schools remains in regular contact for both general communications and updates along with continued planning for implementation in Tier 2 schools.
- Our contracted staff person working toward our goal of maximum utilization and a smooth roll-out <u>again</u> made more than 30 site visits with school building staff and district administrators









OPPORTUNITIES:

- At the end of Q2 we received a nearly complete school year dataset from the Michigan Department of Education which we will use to update our data models. This will allow us to better forecast participation and cost projections as we move into the next school year.
- We have begun discussions with our marketing team to begin working on coordinated story-telling and media interest in the beginning of the next school year.
- We are receiving multiple inquiries from school buildings to begin the planning phases over the summer in preparation for the next school year and full implementation in the fall.

BARRIERS:

• No current obvious barriers to implementation. We expect continued programmatic success leading into Q3.

BUILDING IMPLEMENTATION UPDATES:

Since the launch of the program, we have successfully executed MOUs with fifteen (15) buildings and the list of those buildings set to implement over the summer is growing. By the end of Q2 there were an additional thirteen (13) buildings in the process of document creation and signatures. Some schools that initiated that process in June will have executed MOUs in July (Q3).

The UWSEM process currently in place requires a fully executed MOU be in place with each individual building. Once this agreement is finalized, equipment orders can take place and full implementation can occur. The table below includes those buildings that have a fully executed MOU and equipment order(s) have been placed and delivered. For the duration of the project we will have buildings in various states of planning and implementation modes.
