Youth Assistance Structure

Youth Assistance is community-based and driven by dedicated volunteers who live or work within the areas they serve. The Sixth Judicial Circuit Court-Family Division provides professional staff to collaborate with these volunteers and offer direct casework services.

Operating costs and local office space for Youth Assistance is provided with the sponsorship of the local school district and associated municipalities. Additional funding is secured through grants, donations, and local fundraising efforts.

The Oakland County Youth Assistance Coordinating Council, Inc. offers guidance, consultation, and support to the central Youth Assistance office and local boards. It also organizes training for board members, coordinates county-wide events, facilitates grant distribution, and manages a county-wide insurance policy for Youth Assistance.

Casework Services

Youth Assistance caseworkers deliver confidential, short-term, family-centered casework and referral services to Oakland County residents (under the age of 18) and their families.

The Sixth Judicial Circuit Court-Family Division may divert cases to Youth Assistance when deemed the most appropriate intervention.

Family & Youth Education

Youth Assistance provides a range of programs aimed at strengthening family relationships, fostering knowledge, and promoting healthy problem-solving strategies. With a variety of topics available, families can select programs tailored to their specific needs. These programs are often co-hosted with local schools and community organizations.

Mentors Plus

Adult volunteers are matched with youth for one-on-one mentorship. Volunteers undergo a screening and training process prior to being paired with a child. Additional training and support continue throughout the mentorship. Each volunteer commits to spending 1-2 hours per week with their mentee for at least one year.

Skill Building

Youth Assistance offers scholarships to youth who would benefit from enriching learning experiences.

Skill-building opportunities include academic, athletic, cultural, and life-skills activities are designed to broaden horizons, enhance specific abilities, and boost self-confidence and self-esteem.

Youth Recognition

Youth are recognized for making positive contributions in the community or achieving personal success while overcoming adversity. Nominations are submitted by schools, community organizations, and local residents. Community leaders and dignitaries from across the county and state participate in celebrating these young individuals.

Camp

Scholarships are available for youth to attend day or overnight camps, providing opportunities to build independence, confidence, and skills in a supportive environment.

Youth Involvement

With adult guidance, youth actively engage in planning, leading, and participating in Youth Assistance projects within their communities. This involvement helps young people develop leadership skills while contributing to the well being of their local areas.
