Water Loss Adjustment Policy





Former Policy


- Bill adjustment made if leak is discovered and repaired.
- Evidence required for leak repair.
 Example: Paid labor and material invoice.
- Adjustments are calculated using the wholesale water rate (what WRC paid to provide the water to the home).
- Once in a lifetime adjustment.



- Bill adjustment made if leak is repaired or if high usage returns to normal (unexplained water loss).
- Evidence required if available (if a repair can be determined by reviewing usage history documentation is not required).
- Adjustment are calculated to reflect typical or average use for similar period.
- As needed.

Owner-Requested Water Shutoff

- New form for property owner to submit to WRC Billing Services Office
- Vacancy required
 - WRC will no longer shut off water service to an occupied home when the owner is not the occupant
- Full payment for the shutoff service is required by the property owner and will not be added to the water bill payment



Next Steps



- Implement SpryPoint, our new billing software, to provide customers with:
 - Online billing portal for bill pay and account management
 - Text message notifications about bill and other important information
- Develop payment plan options to help customers pay their water and sewer bills without being threatened with a shutoff notice



Countywide program



Customers experiencing hardship that fall within 200-300% poverty level



Applications will be processed on a first-come, firstserved basis based on current funding



Residents may apply once every 12 months



Benefits include plumbing repairs, up to three months of water services, and/or water debt forgiveness
