Welcomes and Introductions –Lisa Hahn

Lisa welcomed members new and old.

Updates:

Flavia Maccio-Great Start Collaborative

Flavia announced they will be hosting a drive-thru health event at Oakland Schools on June 3rd. There will be different kits available for children ages 0-5 years.

Townhall for the 2024-2017 years. Health partners will be coming together for maternal health.

Lisa Hahn-OCHD

Lisa spoke about the infant Vitality Grant. They want to know what is working well. In 2019 there was the lowest number of infant deaths, but still a high rate of disparity. They want to know what the community needs. Four focus groups have been completed at this point. LGBTQ, Fathers, Special needs and Hispanic. The in-person meeting will be on July 20th from 11-12. It will also include the ability to network with other partners.

Michele Maloff -OCHD-Nurse Family Partnership

Michele reported that the teams parent involvement has been great! The team has been working on hosting 3-4 events per year. Today the team is hosting a picnic in the park for their families. The parents have really enjoyed being to provide input on the upcoming events.

The state is working on a CQI training session for the parents. The CQI project for the team is taking health equity to the next level. Currently, we are exploring a health equity toolkit. Oakland County is developing the toolkit and NFP may be the pilot for it.

Kate Beszka- OCHD-WIC

Kate discussed how WIC operates. It's considered a supplemental food program. Each participant is allotted between \$50-\$100 per month. There are 8 WIC locations throughout Oakland County, and they also partner with OLHSA.

Kate explained in more detail who they serve, benefits and income guidelines. New moms are eligible for different packages based on if they are breastfeeding and delivery method. The staff are in the different offices throughout the week. Monday thru Wednesday they are in Pontiac. Tuesday and Thursday they are in Southfield and Tuesday and Friday they are in Walled Lake.

Todd Lipa-CARES in Farmington Hills

CARES (Community Action Resources Empowerment Services) is a food pantry that services various locations throughout the county. They purchase food from Gleaners and other community partners. They hope to have a WIC store in the future. They do have emergency boxes.

They operate with a small staff and expressed their concern about the number of families needing services and they are hopeful they can keep up with the need.

Jessica Ramsay- Gleaners Community Food Bank

Gleaners is also a food pantry that services five counties throughout Michigan. They strive to provide all homes with healthy food and nutritional education along with cooking matters programs. Their goal is for a hunger free community. Gleaners has seen an increase in rates of food insecurities post covid.

They are now working with a mobile food distribution unit. Additional information on this can be found at pantrynet.org.

Joanne Wrobel-OCHD-Nutrition Services

Joanne presented on the nutrition services that her team provides. Those eligible are pregnant women, post-partum moms and infants up to 18 years of age with a medical condition that effects their nutrition. Those on Snap, WIC, Medicaid are eligible, but that is not mandatory. Lastly, Joanne explained the importance of nutrition in the first 1000 days of a baby's life.

David Roth- OCHD-FIMR

Dave reported that there have been 4 sleep related infant deaths this year. We have seen an increase in Oakland County as well as surrounding counties and most sleep deaths are related to co-sleeping. In addition, it has been discovered that 4 out of 5

deaths involved the father of the baby. He asked if anyone is aware of any Men's groups in the area.

Dave asked if any organization would like to participate in support of other groups with models and displays. We also have Facebook posts that can be shared. Lisa asked the community members to get involved. She stated that creating awareness helps.
