## **WRAP Income Based Plan**

#### What is WRAP?

- ♦ WRAP provides short term assistance to qualifying low-income households in the GLWA service area through:
  - Bill Credits
  - Arrearage Assistance
  - Conservation Measures & Minor Plumbing Repairs
- It is funded through GLWA annual budgeted revenues
- ◆ The program is administered by local service delivery partners



## **WRAP Eligibility**

- ♦ Households are eligible for WRAP if they meet the following criteria:
  - Reside within the GLWA service area
  - Household income at or below 200% of the federal poverty level
  - Establish they are responsible for the water bill
  - Live in a home they own OR rent
- Eligible households with a senior citizen or person with permanent disabilities are eligible to receive bill credits without an expiration date



## **Recent Program Improvements**

- ♠ Increase accessibility by eliminating the opt-in requirement
- ◆ Bill credit amount provided is unique to each household and is based on their annual income and bill amount (WRAP Income Based Plan)
- **♦** Emphasis on direct client assistance & case management to reduce administrative burden on communities



#### **Overview of WRAP Elements**

#### **Bill Credits**

- Amount is unique to each household
- Based on income & amount of water & sewer bill
- After applied, the amount the household is expected to pay is ~3% of the household income
- Rapid Assistance available

#### **Arrearage Assistance**

- Up to \$1,200 in arrearage assistance upon enrollment in Year 1
- Up to \$1,200 in arrearage assistance upon enrollment in Year 2
- A household does not need to have a past due balance or be in shutoff status to enroll in WRAP

#### **Conservation & Plumbing Repairs**

- Up to \$2,000 in services such as:
  - Home Water Audit
  - Minor Plumbing Repairs
  - Educational information regarding water usage
- Emphasis on a healthy home



## **WRAP Income Based Plan Example**

- **♦** Example WRAP Income Based Plan (IBP) Household:
  - Household Annual Income: \$10,000
  - Annual Bill Amount: \$1,000
  - Previously \$300 per year in bill credits
  - WRAP IBP: \$700 per year in bill credits

## **Program Details**

- AccessH2O provides financial assistance, education, and support to individuals and families experiencing temporary financial hardship to avoid water shut-off
- The program is designed to be a solution for customers needing assistance to recover from temporary hardship or to catch-up from a past due balance
- Support will not exceed \$1,200 per customer
