IMMEDIATELY REPORT the following diseases to the Communicable Disease Unit of Oakland County Health Division (OCHD) during work hours at: 248-858-1286 or after hours at 248-858-0931 (ask for Health Administrator on call).

- **Meningococcal Disease**
(bacterial meningitis/meningococcemia)
- **Rubella**
(German measles)
- **Measles**
(Rubeola)

Below is a list of required reportable diseases/conditions which **must be reported to OCHD within 24 hours**.

The following diseases or conditions are required to be reported as part of your aggregate counts through the Oakland County Health & Human Services Portal (HHSCP).

- Flu-like Illness (weekly)
- Stomach Virus (weekly)
- Unspecified Illness (weekly)
- COVID-19 (daily)

NOTE: Hand, Foot, and Mouth disease, Conjunctivitis (Pink Eye), Impetigo, Mono, Pediculosis (Head Lice), Ringworm, and Scabies only need to be reported if there are two (2) or more cases in one week. Call 248-858-1286 with questions.
