CHILDHOOD LEAD POISONING PREVENTION PROGRAM

Oakland County Health Division is committed to increasing childhood lead screening and education. Lead exposure can change the nervous system, which is irreversible, but lead poisoning is preventable if screened early for lead exposure. Michigan lawmakers recently passed legislation which will require universal lead screening for 1- and 2-year-olds.
