Oakland County Neighborhood & Housing Development BABA Checklist for CDBG Infrastructure Projects

The Build America, Buy America Act (BABA) requires that all iron and steel, construction materials, and manufactured products used in federally funded infrastructure projects are produced in the United States. This requirement, known as the "Buy America Preference" (BAP), is detailed in the <u>Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, Pub. L. 117-58</u> and <u>2 CFR 184</u>. Infrastructure is defined by HUD as activities involving rehabilitation, maintenance, and construction of housing, public facilities, and improvements.

This form is utilized during HUD's Phased Implementation to determine which phase and if any waivers apply for projects subject to BAP. All projects that use any amount of CDBG or other federal grant fund, is an infrastructure project, and total cost from all sources is equal to or greater than \$250,000, will be subject to BABA under BAP. Projects with a total cost under \$250,000 does not apply due to De Minimis, Small Grants, and Minor Components Waiver.
