2024 State Revolving Fund Project Plan Amendment

DATE: February 27, 2024

In May 2022, this Board approved the Clinton River Water Recourse Recovery Facility Project Plan. The plan was then submitted to the State of Michigan for access to the State Revolving Fund to help cover projects costs.

Subsequently, it was discovered that the selected secondary treatment improvement option in the original plan was more expensive than anticipated. Additionally, its construction was more precarious because of proposed extensive excavation close to existing structures. A new technology option for the secondary treatment improvement, called a Mobile Organic Biofilm System, was investigated in late 2023. This new technology is less expensive to implement and avoids the previous construction excavation concerns.

As required by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy, the Project Plan Amendment was posted on the website for public review and comments prior to the Board formally adopting the amendment which recommends utilizing the Mobile Organic Biofilm System for the secondary treatment improvements.

Requested Action: Adopt the attached resolution and authorize the implementation of the project identified in the Project Plan amendment.

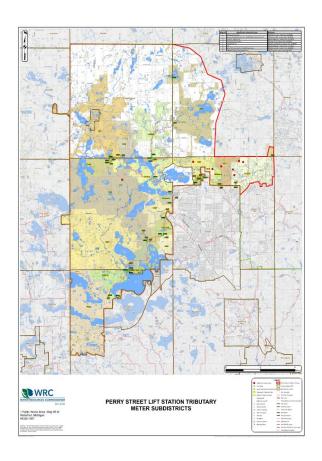

Annually, the Drainage Board for the Clinton River Water Resource Recovery Facility Drainage District approves the maintenance assessment recommendation and special assessment roll for current and future fiscal years. Included in the development of the maintenance assessment recommendation and special assessment roll is the long-range plan for both major maintenance and capital improvement projects at the facility. Major maintenance projects represent the larger maintenance activities required for operation of the plant and are not considered to be a part of the standard, day-to-day operation and maintenance. Capital improvement projects include new construction, replacement of existing assets and/or work that extends the useful life of the existing assets.

Operations staff has evaluated the conditions of both the Auburn plant and the East Boulevard plant, which together makes up the Clinton River Water Resource Recovery Facility. They compiled the attached project list which includes ongoing projects as well as projects to be initiated during Fiscal Year 2025.

The attached tables provide a list of FY2023 and FY2024 projects that have been previously approved and are currently in progress. Of the projects in progress, the cells in the "Total Project Budget" column that are highlighted yellow and require a budget amendment to complete the work. Also included in the tables are additional proposed FY2024 projects that have yet to be initiated.

Also included in the tables is a list of proposed FY2025 projects that have yet to be initiated. These projects initially were slated to be created at the end of FY2024, but the associated expenses will not hit the reserve funds until FY2025.

Staff recommends amending the existing project budgets as shown on these tables and initiating the new projects for FY2024 and FY2025.

On April 27, 2021, the Chapter 20 Policy Matters Board approved an updated Stormwater Engineering Design Standards for all Separate Storm System Chapter 20 Drains. Adoption of these standards meets federal Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System permit requirements as outlined in Oakland County's current permit for county-owned or operated separate stormwater systems. The standards include stormwater management requirements for Channel Protection Volume Control (Infiltration), Channel Protection Rate Control, Water Quality Control, Operations and Maintenance, and Detention and Flood Control (storage and release rate).

Because the approved standards only apply to separate storm systems, a requirement for the allowable release rate for the George W. Kuhn Drain needs to be established and adopted. In previous versions of the county's stormwater standards, the stormwater requirements were applied to combined sewer systems including the GWK Drain Drainage District.

Based on the system design and to ensure adequate capacity, staff recommends this Board adopt a release rate not to exceed 0.2 cubic feet per second per acre. This rate is consistent with the previous GWK Drain release rate requirement for both new development and redevelopment projects.

RainSmart Rebates, a residential Green Stormwater Infrastructure rebate pilot program for the George W. Kuhn Drain Drainage District, has received more than 340 applications since it began accepting applications on January 2, 2024. At its September 26, 2023 meeting, this Board authorized \$200,000 spread over two years (2024-2025) for the distribution of homeowner rebates after successful installations of rain gardens, rain barrels, and trees through the RainSmart Rebates program.

Given the high interest in the program and the waitlist that has been established, the WRC intends to utilize up to \$180,000 in rebates this year. The remaining \$20,000 will be reserved for the equity grant in 2025.

Long-term, alternative funding will be pursued later in the year when the installation metrics are known.

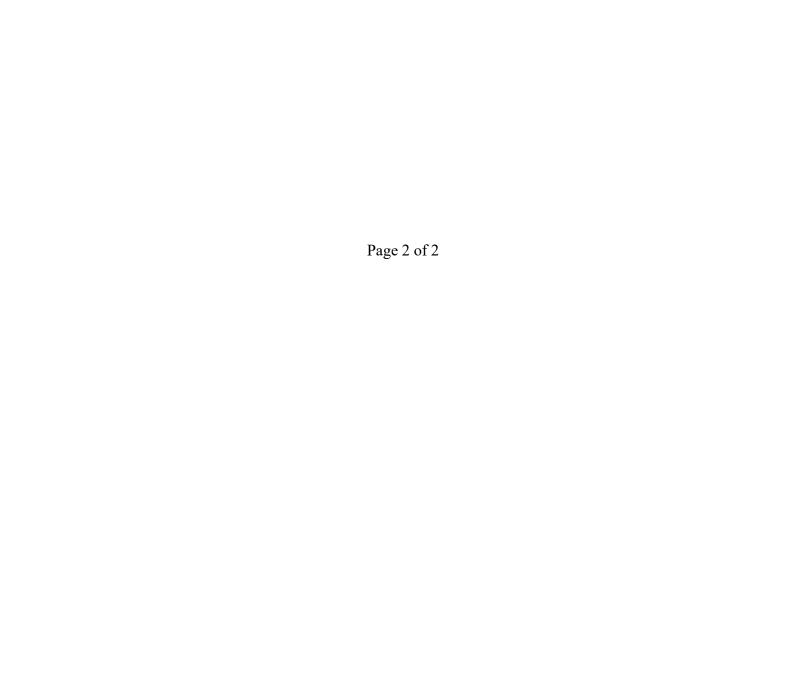
