

Can I Vote While In Jail?



Many people believe that if you are detained in jail during an election you cannot vote.

But this is not true!

You have the full legal right to vote while you are detained in jail so long as you are not currently serving a sentence.

In fact, you are eligible to register and vote in Michigan *even if*:

Your vote and your voice matter!



- You have a felony record.
- You are on probation, parole, or tether.
- You are awaiting arraignment, trial, or sentencing, regardless of your incarceration status.
- Your housing is unstable.
- You have a disability.
- You do not have a Michigan ID.

If you are eligible, Michigan law requires that you must be provided with access to vote in jail. Contact a VAAC voting ambassador at contact@votingaccessforall.org for the materials you need to vote!
