HISTORY OF OAKLAND COUNTY EXECUTIVE STRUCTURE

Before 1973, most Michigan counties operated under a General Law form of government, where a county board of commissioners shared executive and legislative functions with other elected and appointed officials.

In 1973, Public Act 139 introduced the Optional Unified Form of County Government, allowing counties to adopt a new structure. This form includes two alternatives: a county board of commissioners sharing executive functions with either an appointed county manager (Unified Form, Alternate A) or an elected county executive (Unified Form, Alternate B). Oakland County was the first to adopt this form in 1974, electing Daniel Murphy as its first county executive. Bay County followed in 1978. Today, Oakland and Bay are the only counties using this system.

Notably, Daniel Murphy's legacy continues in Oakland County, with his daughter Gwen Markham serving on the Board of Commissioners and his son Jerry Murphy on the Oakland County Historical Commission.

The County Executive's responsibilities are similar to those of a governor or mayor of a large city. They administer the government on a day-to-day basis, propose new programs, and revamp existing programs. The County Executive represents the interests of more than 1.2 million residents.

Under this structure the Board of Commissioners performs a role similar to a state legislature or city council. It acts on proposals submitted by the County Executive and makes proposals of its own. It possesses the legislative and administrative powers granted by state law. The County Executive may veto acts of the Board and the vetoes can be overridden by a two- thirds vote of the Board.

The executive form of government did not change the third branch of government, the judiciary. Similarly, the five other offices headed by officials elected countywide remain unchanged. These are the Oakland County Prosecutor, Sheriff, Clerk/Register of Deeds, Treasurer and Water Resources Commissioner.

Oakland Community Health Network's (OCHN) mission is to inspire hope, empower people and strengthen communities through public behavioral health services provided to Oakland County residents.

OCHN is contracted by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to lead a service provider network and manage care for approximately 30,000 Oakland County residents at more than 400 service sites across the county. People who receive public behavioral health services through OCHN's provider network include those who have an intellectual or developmental disability, mental health concerns, or substance use disorder. Most of these individuals have Medicaid insurance coverage.

A full array of behavioral health and community-based services are offered through OCHN's contracted, service provider network, including evaluation and screening; hospital and residential treatment; respite care; clubhouse and day programs, supported employment; multilingual programs; correction services; and dual diagnosis for individuals with both a mental health and substance use disorder.

OCHN's goal is to ensure these individuals are aware of and have access to services and support that will improve their health and quality of life, as well as ensure their engagement in full community participation. Its mission to "inspire hope, empower people, and strengthen communities" reflects an unyielding belief in a "Valuable System for Valued People." Oakland County Parks (OCP) is dedicated to creating and operating accessible, welcoming and sustainable parks and public spaces; providing recreational and educational programming; preserving open space; stewarding the environment; helping people be healthier; and building connected communities in Oakland County. Half of residents live within a 10-minute drive of an Oakland County park.

Throughout its history, which began when the parks system was first established in 1966, OCP has played an important role in the lives of Oakland County residents. Many have cherished memories of taking family camping trips, walking the trails, attending nature programming, enjoying golf outings or spending hot summer days at the waterpark.

The parks system started with 190 acres. Today, it boasts more than 7,010 acres with 100 miles of trails across 17 parks and hosts more than two million visitors each year. OCP provides a vast diversity of recreation, leisure and learning opportunities at two nature centers, three dog parks, five golf courses, two campgrounds, a waterpark, an ORV park and the Oakland County Farmers Market, which offers fresh produce and products from local farmers and artisans year-round.

Oakland County residents have supported the maintenance and growth of the parks system by approving every millage vote since 1966.



Over the past year, significant developments have included:

- Implementing free park entry for Oakland County day-use parks and dog parks (excluding pay to play attractions such as golf courses, waterpark, campground, off-road vehicle activities). This was part of the 2024 millage request that voters approved by nearly 70 percent in November.
- Opening new features to enhance the guest experience, including a new Solar System Trail at Addison Oaks County Park and pickleball courts and a universally accessible playscape at Lyon Oaks County Park.
- Continuing long-term partnerships with Madison Heights, Oak Park, Pontiac and Southfield
 to enhance community parks and expand the OCP system and allocating funding for capital
 grants and partnerships with Hazel Park, Royal Oak Township, Oak Park, Pontiac and
 Southfield. As part of the Healthy Communities Park and Outdoor Recreation Investment
 Plan, grand openings were held for new accessible playgrounds at Green Acres Park in
 Hazel Park and Mack-Rowe Park in Royal Oak Township.
- Receiving a \$2,175,000 grant from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund to secure
 acquisition of Turtle Woods, a 70-acre area of woods and wetlands in Troy. OCP will operate
 and maintain the property as a county park and nature preserve. The acquisition was made
 possible through a partnership with OCP, the Troy School District and Six Rivers Land
 Conservancy.
- Hosting world-class events like the BMX Stars and Stripes National competition and Baja SAE event at Holly Oaks ORV Park that attracted thousands of competitors and spectators. New events, such as the Tails & Trails Race and White Lake Oaks Craft Show, were also introduced.
- Distributing 17,000 native plants at spring and fall events.
- Providing more than 300 recreation visits through the Recreation Assistance Partnership Program (RAPP), serving 87 percent of Oakland County's cities, villages and townships.



ADDISON OAKS COUNTY PARK AND CAMPGROUND

This 1,140-acre natural oasis offers camping, boating, picnicking, fishing, a Solar System Trail and more. It features an 18-hole disc golf course and a 20-mile system of trails for hiking, mountain or fat tire biking, cross-country skiing and equestrian use. The campground offers individual and group sites, rental cabins and yurts, and campground recreation activities. The historic, Tudor-style Buhl Estate, located in the park, is perfect for weddings, banquets, reunions, receptions and more.

CATALPA OAKS COUNTY PARK

Catalpa Oaks preserves 24 acres of green space in Southfield adjacent to the South Oakland Health Department. The park features one youth and four large soccer fields and playgrounds, including a universally-accessible playscape and swings for all abilities. A .8-mile aggregate perimeter pathway around the park provides a walking and running loop. The Vincent Gregory Pavilion offers picnic table seating for 100 people. Modern restrooms are on site and open daily April through October.

GLEN OAKS GOLF COURSE

This picturesque, 18-hole, par 70 course includes a 1920s English-style stone clubhouse with a club room, an event center and an outdoor patio. The clubhouse also offers a pro shop. A formal garden on the grounds is ideal for outdoor weddings and other special occasions.

GROVELAND OAKS COUNTY PARK AND CAMPGROUND

14555 Dixie Highway, Holly......(248) 634-9811

This 360-acre park and campground on Stewart Lake features a sandy beach with swimming, fishing, boating and pedal boating. It also has three large children's playscapes, a camp store, miniature golf, campground recreation program, shuffleboard court, bocce ball court, a skate-board park, bike skills course, gaga pit, arcade, basketball and volleyball courts and paved trails. Pedal boats, kayaks and bikes are available to rent. Campers have a choice of modern, individual or group campsites, rental cabins and yurts.

HIGHLAND OAKS COUNTY PARK

Located within the headwaters of the Shiawassee River headwaters, this 302-acre park preserves sensitive habitat while providing excellent recreational experiences in a beautiful natural setting among rolling hills, wetlands and pastures. It has 2.5 miles of multi-purpose trails that provide an opportunity for hiking, geocaching, cross-country and equestrian activities. Fishing is also permitted on the accessible floating dock.



HOLLY OAKS ORV PARK

14551 Shields Road, Holly(248) 881-3821

Consisting of former active sand and gravel mines, this park is located off I-75 at the Grange Hall Road exit and Dixie Highway, near Groveland Oaks County Park and Campground. Crisscrossed by old mining trails, it features extreme terrain, ranging from mud flats to 40' vertical cliffs and is open to all types of ORVs, including full-size vehicles, side-by-sides, ATVs and motorcycles. The "North 60" is a "scramble area" in which riders are free to make their own paths. There is a daily entry fee, and an ORV license and trail permit is required. This park is a joint state-county project operated by OCP in partnership with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR).

INDEPENDENCE OAKS COUNTY PARK

9501 Sashabaw Road, Clarkston.....(248) 625-0877

This 1,286-acre park – the largest in the Oakland County Parks system – features year-round recreation with more than 12 miles of trails for hiking, biking and cross-country skiing. The 68-acre Crooked Lake provides fishing and boating opportunities. Swimming is available at Hidden Beach. Guests can enjoy the archery range, picnic areas, rental shelters, court games and playground equipment. Wint Nature Center provides year-round education programs presented by park naturalists. It features an outdoor sensory garden as well as a bird feeding station and natural viewing area. Camp Wilderness, a 10-acre primitive campground, offers camping experiences to youth groups and features platform tents, pavilion, a fire circle, a modern bathhouse, picnic tables, charcoal grills and access to park amenities.

INDEPENDENCE OAKS-NORTH

10089 Sashabaw Road, Clarkston.....(248) 625-0877

This park features a 312-foot boardwalk connecting to a 180-foot-long fishing dock. It is a destination for fishing, hiking, birdwatching and non-motorized boating. Anglers can launch canoes, kayaks or other non-motorized boats. Upper Bushman Lake is catch-and-release only as designated by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR).

LYON OAKS COUNTY PARK AND GOLF COURSE

52221 Pontiac Trail, Wixom (248) 437-1488

This park preserves 800 acres of environmentally sensitive wetlands within its 1,041 acres. It features an Arthur Hills-designed 18-hole championship golf course with a driving range and elegant event facilities. The day-use area has a picnic shelter and playground, pickleball courts, volleyball, horseshoes pits, soccer fields and a cricket pitch. There are six miles of trails for biking, on-leash dog walking and cross-country skiing. Dogs can play off-leash at the popular 13-acre, fenced Lyon Oaks Dog Park.



ORION OAKS COUNTY PARK

More than 916 acres of environmentally sensitive green space is preserved within this park, which offers boating and fishing on the 90-acre Lake Sixteen, as well as 10 miles of trails for hiking, biking and cross-country skiing. A wheelchair accessible fishing dock and 120-foot boardwalk links two trail systems. The 24-acre Orion Oaks Dog Park features enclosures for off-leash play, two trails, fields, picnic pavilion and modern restrooms.

PONTIAC OAKS COUNTY PARK

Formerly known as Hawthorne Park, this park preserves 77 acres of green space and features the shorelines of Creger Lake and Upper Silver Lake with water access for kayaking, canoeing and fishing provided through a dock and boat launch. The park also offers a playground, pavilion, horseshoes pits, picnic area and an 18-hole disc golf course. OCP collaborated with The City of Pontiac to assume operations of the park, while the city retains ownership.

RED OAKS COUNTY PARK

This 163-acre park, which sits atop the enclosed George W. Kuhn Drain, is a unique example of repurposing urban land for recreational use. It features a dog park, golf course, nature center and waterpark. Red Oaks Dog Park at 31353 Dequindre Road, offers more than five acres with three fenced enclosures, a small-dog area and a picnic shelter. At Red Oaks Golf Course, 29600 John R. Road, golfers can enjoy a 9-hole, Jerry Matthews-designed course that also offers warm-up hitting nets. Red Oaks Waterpark, 1455 E. 13 Mile Road, offers fun for all ages with a wave-action pool, triple-flume waterslide, river ride and children's splashpad with 52 interactive water features, including a water play climber with slides and dumping bucket. Red Oaks Nature Center, 30300 Hales St., features interpretive nature and live animal exhibits, interactive displays, a sensory trail and a storybook trail. It also provides opportunities for fieldtrips, birthday parties, homeschool programs and more.

ROSE OAKS COUNTY PARK

10501 Buckhorn Lake Road, Holly......(248) 599-2708

Several glacier lakes within this nearly 650-acre undeveloped park provide contrasts to the gently rolling meadows and wooded uplands. The park is a favorite of equestrians who explore its five miles of trails, including accessible boardwalks and floating docks, which are also shared by hikers, cyclists, geocachers and cross-country skiers. Fishing is permitted and non-motorized boats and electric motorboats are allowed; carry-in only.



SPRINGFIELD OAKS COUNTY PARK AND GOLF COURSE

12451 Andersonville Road, Davisburg......(248) 599-2708

This 332-acre park includes an 18-hole golf course that is conveniently located just north of Clarkston. A multi-purpose event center hosts banquets, receptions and 4-H events. The park is also home to the historic Ellis Barn, which is a popular site for weddings, and home to the annual Oakland County Fair, which draws more than 100,000 visitors to the 10-day event annually.

WATERFORD OAKS COUNTY PARK

Multiple addresses in Waterford(248) 858-0916

Headquarters of the Oakland County Parks and Recreation Commission at 2800 Watkins Lake Road, 199-acre Waterford Oaks is also home to more than three miles of hiking trails; a universally accessible playscape; two platform tennis and year-round pickleball courts; the world-class Waterford Oaks Bicycle Motocross (BMX) Track; sand volleyball courts; a winter family sledding hill; and outdoor fitness equipment. Lookout Lodge, Waterford Oaks Event Center and picnic shelters are available for rent. The Oakland County Farmers Market, at 2350 Pontiac Lake Road, provides grower-direct produce, fresh flowers and artisan goods year-round.

WHITE LAKE OAKS GOLF COURSE

991 Williams Lake Road, White Lake.....(248) 698-2700

This scenic, 18-hole, par 70 course includes 194 acres that feature woodlands and wetlands. It also has a pro shop, club room and garden patio. The event center, which overlooks the golf course and has the capacity for approximately 180 people, is available for rent.

OAKLAND COUNTY ROADS

Almost half the highways, roads, and streets in Oakland County are part of the county system, which is under the jurisdiction of the Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC).

Totaling more than 2,700 miles, RCOC's road system includes all public roads in townships, except state highways, and some through-streets in most cities and villages. It is the largest county system in Michigan, second in size only to the state highway system. Subdivision streets in the townships alone make up more than 1,300 miles.

In 1992, RCOC embarked on a program called FAST-TRAC, an Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) effort. The Road Commission has installed "smart" traffic signals operated by computers and video vehicle detection at more than 850 intersections across the county. This is one of the largest and most advanced adaptive traffic control systems in the United States and the largest video imaging system for traffic management in the world. The Road Commission was the first local unit of government to initiate a program of this scope and magnitude.

For paving and resurfacing of subdivision streets, property owners can petition RCOC to create a special assessment district through a process prescribed by state law. The process begins by contacting the Road Commission, then petitioning and participating in public hearings.

The Board of Road Commissioners is separate from county general government – establishing policies as authorized by state statutes for management of the countywide road system, administering its own budget and hiring its own full-time managing director and staff.

OAKLAND COUNTY SCHOOLS





Oakland Schools is one of Michigan's 56 intermediate school districts (ISDs). It was established by the Michigan Legislature in 1962. ISDs are regional service agencies that offer support services to school personnel that are best delivered regionally, as measured by cost, size, and quality advantages. Oakland Schools is an autonomous, tax-supported public school district governed by Michigan General School Laws.

Oakland Schools offers support services to 28 school districts and a growing list of public school academies serving more than 175,000 students in Oakland County. The organization has developed strong partnerships with all levels of government, business, and social agencies to enhance the quality of education in the region.
