Families should Call Nurse on Call (800-848-5533) to inquire about children's immunization status and to find out about Oakland County's Homebound vaccination program especially for families with limited transportation. Families with concerns for their child's development should reach out to Early on (248-209-2084) for a referral for newborns to age 3. — Elizabeth Miller

WIC is now offering grocery store tours with clients to ensure that they are getting the groceries that are covered by the program. They will meet the client in Meijer's and support and educate them on the food choices that are being made. – Lisa Banks

As of April 30, the Universal Lead Testing is in full effect. Every 1- and 2-year-old will get tested for lead at their well visit. Families can get tested 5 days a week in the health department. – Michelle Allread

All about Doulas: Michigan Medicaid Clients can now have a doula covered under their health plan or through straight Medicaid. Clients are allowed 12 prenatal/postpartum visits and the attendance of the birth. Having a doula to go over a birth plan and support you through the journey is beneficial. They will advocate for you and help you make informed decisions, as well as help you with different positions while in labor.

**Infant & Maternal Health support:** Trinity Health Michigan is a value-driven faith-based health organization serving the needs of all people. They were recently recognized for excellent performance with NTSB caesarean rates, low episiotomy rates and low newborn complication rates. They offer prenatal education classes, perinatal peer navigation program which provides support for families with infants prenatally exposed to substances and postpartum education resources.

Babies transitioning from extended NICU to Homelife: Families often experience chronic admission stressors like limited parental leave, mental health issues, separation from newborn and financial strain. Often emotions are all over the place; some struggle with grief, exhaustion, trauma and frustration. The transition home may come with barriers such as medical equipment limitations, limited resources and childcare, employment changes and the need for additional support. Life at home will now look different; bills, insurance, appointments and transportation could all bring about challenges.

**Nurse-Family Partnership:** NFP is a program for first time moms 28 weeks or less through 2 years of age looking for a home visiting nursing program. NFP is currently working on postpartum hemorrhage; increasing client's knowledge to be able to get them the help they need so they can advocate for themselves. NFP is accepting new clients.

**FIMR:** We currently have a spotlight on promoting home visiting programs, more education to breastfeeding moms falling asleep and suffocating babies.
