Three Oakland County Parks offer diverse camping experiences, each with its own unique character. Independence Oaks (in Clarkston) offers camping for organized groups. Addison Oaks (near Rochester) and Groveland Oaks (near Holly) campgrounds feature family camping.

Located minutes from I-75, Independence Oaks County Park offers overnight camping for organized youth groups including churches, scouts, day camps and more. Designed with these groups in mind, Camp Wilderness includes two areas, for 60 and 100 campers. Amenities include water and electricity, platform tents, pavilions, a heated modern bathhouse, fire rings, benches, grills and picnic tables.

The primitive campground is nestled within the 1,268-acre park, surrounded by a wooded area and an open field. Wilderness Bridge leads campers to the 10-acre site.

Campers also have access to Wint Nature Center exhibits, wildlife feeding area and personalized programs led by trained naturalists; more than 12 miles of hiking trails; archery range; swimming beach (not lifeguarded); fishing and boating on 68-acre Crooked Lake; and a 2.2-mile paved path connecting to the Sashabaw Road safety path.

Family Camping

Addison Oaks and Groveland Oaks offer camping for "roughing it" or for those who prefer a few creature comforts in the outdoors. Come to visit for weekend or spend a couple weeks. From tent camping to rental cabins, yurts plus group sites, there's an outdoor experience for everyone.

Reservations can be made approximately six months (180 days) in advance for campsites, cabins and yurts at Addison Oaks and Groveland Oaks campgrounds. Group and facility reservations are accepted 335 days (approximately 11 months) in advance.

Addison Oaks Campground features six cabins (2-, 4- and 6-person), two yurts, eight group areas and 170 individual sites, including pull-through sites. Each campsite includes water and electricity; laundry facilities are also available. Campground amenities include a popular campground recreation program on weekends from Memorial Day through Labor Day, plus Halloween special event weekends in October.



Addison Oaks County Park is open year-round, with a myriad recreational opportunities including hiking, biking (single-track mountain bike and winter fat tire bike trails), equestrian trails, picnicking, playgrounds, camping and more on 1,140 wooded acres.

The picturesque park also offers two playscapes, a 18hole disc golf course; bike, train rides (\$); boat and kayak rentals; a 20-mile trail system; and two fishing lakes.

Groveland Oaks Campground features a beautiful sandy beach (not lifeguarded); large 50' x 50' full hookup and modern campsites; eight camper cabins (2-, 4- and 6-person); four yurts, including two on Cottage Island; and two island pavilions for group parties.



Groveland Oaks Campground is conveniently located located on Dixie Highway with Holly Oaks ORV Park nearby.

Activity is the name of the game at Groveland Oaks. Campers and park visitors will find pedal boat, kayak and paddle board rentals; GaGa ball pit; specialty bike rental and a bike skills course; train rides (\$); miniature golf; a skateboard park; an arcade; basketball, sand volleyball, shuffleboard and bocce ball courts; and a popular campground recreation program with crafts, games and outdoor concerts from Memorial Day through Labor Day, plus Halloween special event weekends in September.

Families also enjoy three large children's playscapes, a fishing pier and paved and grass trails. Campground comforts include laundry facilities and a campground store.
