Nays - 0

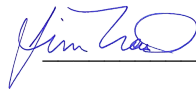

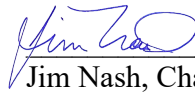

DATE: July 22, 2025

Beginning in 2022, the Office of the Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner began an initiative to develop a program that would help mitigate the damage caused by increasingly severe storm events causing basement backups in Oakland County. This initiative resulted in the HomeGuard Pilot Program, which was publicized and executed in the City of Berkley for approximately one year, beginning in April of 2024. The Pilot Program was closed this past spring and the project team has subsequently been working on ensuring all installations have been properly closed out, evaluating and documenting lessons learned, and summarizing the overall Pilot Program in the HomeGuard Pilot Program Implementation Report.

An overview of the Pilot Program's accomplishments follows:

- Applications
 - 252 total applicants, 132 from within the defined pilot area
 - 151 homes inspected (60% of total applicants)
 - 44 installations completed (29% of inspections, 17% of total applicants)
- Project Finances
 - Pilot Program total cost: \$826,000
 - Average installation cost: \$9,062
 - Minimum installation cost: \$3,255
 - Maximum installation cost: \$13,616

The cost per installation varies widely due to plumbing and/or electrical variability and site-specific issues. However, the bid pricing indicated that an average home installation would be \$10,945. The Pilot results show that the team assumed a reasonable typical level of effort.

The Pilot Program total cost includes planning and design efforts, which focused on creating web-based protocols that were easily accessible by all team members and aided in efficiency of communication and record keeping. This approach proved successful and provides a scalable template that can be implemented in a potential future, large-scale project.

Unfortunately, during the implementation of this program several state and federal grant programs shifted focus or were discontinued. Consequently, no current funding mechanism outside of assessments to the George W. Kuhn Drain Drainage District is known. The project team has documented the results of the Pilot Program and proposes to pause additional efforts until a more favorable funding mechanism is identified.

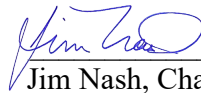

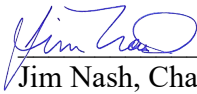

SUBJECT: OUTFRONT Media LLC Request to Modify Existing Billboard Lease

DATE: July 22, 2025

OUTFRONT Media recently terminated one of its three billboard leases. Termination is permissible under terms of the existing lease. The lease was terminated due to a change in conditions when access to the billboard was restricted by the Michigan Department of Transportation.

OUTFRONT Media has recently proposed converting one of the two remaining billboards from its current static, or traditional advertisement format, to a digital format. Static billboards feature a single, printed advertisement that remains unchanged during the duration of the contract with the advertiser. Digital billboards, on the other hand, utilize LED screens to display rotating advertisements, often changing every few seconds. Once the billboard format has been changed and is functional, the lease rent will be doubled while increasing the existing \$1,000 annual increase to \$2,000 per year. The proposed amendment also extends the lease for 20 years beginning the month the billboard is converted to a digital format. All other terms and conditions present in the existing lease remain unchanged. An amendment to the other remaining static billboard lease is proposed to be extended to allow the same expiration date for both leases.

Recognizing these billboards continue to be a substantial source of revenue for an economically distressed community, I am pleased to report OUTFRONT Media's proposal to amend the leases for 20 years with an anticipated starting annual rate of \$26,000 for the existing static billboard and \$52,000 for the future digital billboard. These two leases will have annual increases of \$3,000 for each succeeding year. The amended terms are anticipated to bring more than \$2 million in revenue over the duration of the leases.

Requested Action: Authorize the chairperson to execute the lease amendments on behalf of the drainage district.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, LESSOR and LESSEE are parties to that certain lease agreement dated August 18th, 2021 (the “Lease”);

WHEREAS, the current Lease Term expires September 30th, 2031 and LESSEE pays Rent to LESSOR in accordance with the Lease.

WHEREAS, LESSEE desires to convert both of the existing 14’ x 48’ static sign faces on LESSEE’s Sign Structure to digital/LED faces at some undetermined time in the future.

WHEREAS, LESSEE and LESSOR now desire to amend the Lease pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto do hereby agree as follows:

WITNESSETH

1. Capitalized Terms. All capitalized terms used herein, unless otherwise defined herein, have the same meanings ascribed to them in the Lease.

2. Amendments to the Lease:

LESSOR consents to LESSEE converting the static sign faces to 14’ x 48’ digital/LED faces (the “Digital Faces”) based on the following terms and conditions:

LED TERM

The Lease shall be for a Twenty (20) year Term (the “LED Term”) commencing on the LED Completion Date.

The “LED Completion Date” shall be defined as the first day of the calendar month which advertisements shall first be displayed on the Digital Faces.

The LED Term shall supersede the following sentence from the Lease: “The initial term of this lease shall be for a period of Ten (10) year(s) commencing on October 1, 2021.

LED RENT

During the LED Term, LESSEE shall pay to LESSOR as “Rent” the amounts set forth as follows, beginning on the LED Completion Date:



Annual Rent for Year 1 of the LED Term shall be Fifty Two Thousand Dollars and 00/100 (\$52,000). Beginning on the first day of Year 2 of the LED Term and continuing throughout the LED Term, Rent shall escalate annually by Two Thousand Dollars and 00/100 (\$2,000.00) with each Lease Year anniversary. For example purposes, Year 2 Rent shall be \$54,000, Year 3 Rent shall be \$56,000, continuing per the example throughout the LED Term.

LESSOR and LESSEE agree that any Rent paid annually in advance prior to the LED Completion Date shall be credited in the pro-rated amount towards Year 1 LED Rent.

LESSOR and LESSEE acknowledge and agree that LESSEE is not obligated under the Lease or this Amendment to convert its static sign faces to digital/LED faces. If LESSEE does not convert the sign faces to digital/LED faces, the current terms and conditions of the Lease shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

3. Amendment Controls. Except as otherwise set forth herein, all of the terms and conditions of the Lease shall remain in full force and effect. In the event of a conflict between the terms and conditions of this Amendment and the terms and conditions of the Lease, the terms and conditions of this Amendment shall govern.

WHEREAS, the current Lease Term expires September 30th, 2031 and LESSEE pays Rent to LESSOR in accordance with the Lease.

WHEREAS, LESSEE and LESSOR now desire to amend the Lease pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto do hereby agree as follows:

WITNESSETH

1. Capitalized Terms. All capitalized terms used herein, unless otherwise defined herein, have the same meanings ascribed to them in the Lease.

2. Amendments to the Lease:

3. Amendment Controls. Except as otherwise set forth herein, all of the terms and conditions of the Lease shall remain in full force and effect. In the event of a conflict between the terms and conditions of this Amendment and the terms and conditions of the Lease, the terms and conditions of this Amendment shall govern.

4. Counterparts. This Amendment may be executed in one or more counterparts and delivered by regular, certified, registered or electronic mail (in pdf format), each of which shall be deemed an original hereof and all of which together shall be deemed to be one and the same instrument.

On December 19, 2023, this Board accepted a \$530,000 grant from American Rescue Plan Act funds administered through the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy's Clean Water State Revolving Fund program. These funds are intended to implement green stormwater infrastructure (GSI) improvements to the Joseph Jones Drain at Oakland Park. Located at 392 E. Montcalm Street, Oakland Park is owned and maintained by the City of Pontiac. On July 8, 2025, the Pontiac city council dedicated additional easement to the District to accommodate the improvements.

The GSI improvements design was completed by Drummond Carpenter, PLLC and includes a constructed wetland area to collect stormwater runoff and reduce nonpoint source pollution. Oakland Park, which is lower than the adjacent pavement, regularly accumulates standing water after rain events. Currently non-point source pollution is carried by stormwater and is pumped into the local storm sewer system, which is at a higher elevation than the park. Along with creating a constructed wetland, this project will reduce nonpoint source pollution in the storm sewer system by collecting stormwater and improve water quality by facilitating infiltration of runoff and vegetative treatment.

The key project outcomes are to:

- reduce the amount of nitrogen, phosphorus, and total suspended solids from entering the Joseph Jones Drain and thereby the Clinton River;
- reduce standing water in the park and reduce flow into the Joseph Jones Drain during large storm events by holding back a certain volume of water in the wetland area;
- utilize native trees and plants to beautify the space and aid in stormwater filtration; and
- enhance a gathering space for the local community to enjoy.

The Water Resources Commissioner's office solicited proposals from contractors and evaluated them using qualification-based criteria. Of the three proposals submitted, Dalco Services LLC was selected as the most qualified with a bid of \$298,444.02. The project has a construction budget of \$424,400.

Requested action: Authorize the Chairperson to execute the construction contract with Dalco Services LLC for a not-to-exceed price of \$298,444.02.
