Oakland County Health and Human Services (OCHHS) hosted the first annual Health & Housing Summer Fest at Catalpa Oaks Park in Southfield. This event brought together an array of partners to showcase the resources and services available in Oakland County and highlight the importance of coming together to foster community connection. Together, with contributions from our partners, we provided:



200 Backpacks with School Supplies

An event attendee commented on the number of resources available stating, "My daughter doesn't have insurance, so that vision screening helped so much. She also received a beautiful, fully packed backpack, and my husband received a new laptop to start college classes".

OCHHS was also a main sponsor of Micah 6's annual 'Summer Slam' event in Pontiac. This event reached 900+ people and distributed shoes to kids. OCHHS team distributed 40 gun locks and provided vaccines for 24 children.



Developing Affordable and Inclusive Housing

Oakland Together Housing Trust Fund (HTF) aims to increase affordable housing across the county. Since September 2023, 649 mixed-income housing units were approved. Of those, 438 are affordable housing units representing an almost \$180 million investment in affordable and mixed-income housing by leveraging \$23.6 million of HTF, ARPA and County funds.


Three Oaks Communities and Rochester Housing Solutions. The neuro-inclusive neighborhood is the 1st in Oakland County and 2nd in Michigan.



For many immigrants applying for citizenship, it's a long road but worth it. Immigrants who choose to naturalize and become citizens participate in a lengthy process of applications, background checks, interviews, and pass English language and civics tests after meeting eligibility requirements.

New U.S. citizen, Mihaela Stefan from Romania shared, "I've been waiting for a long time, never dreamed of, but it's a dream come true. Becoming a U.S. citizen opens the doors for everything."





Getting the care that is needed for HIV and other sexually transmitted infections (STIs) can feel uncomfortable or stigmatizing. Oakland County Health Division provides discreet, free walk-in services that include:

- HIV/AIDS testing, referral services and education
- PrEP, nPEP and DoxyPEP treatment and counseling
- STI testing, diagnosis, treatment and counseling

Pre-exposure prophylaxis, or PrEP, helps decrease the risk of getting HIV by almost 99% when medications are taken as prescribed. PrEP client, Rashaun, recently celebrated his 5th anniversary using the medication. His success story is an example of the caring relationships built between our staff and clients.

Every year, thousands experience unexpected outcomes during pregnancy, birth and postpartum that result in significant health consequences. Our Nurse Family Partnership (NFP) program aims to improve the health of mothers and children and connect families to community resources. This unique program partners first-time parents with a public health nurse from pregnancy until their child is 2 years old.

Monique, an NFP graduate and advocate for maternal health, describes how her home visiting nurse, Khalia, impacted her life. "Having Khalia, I didn't have to rely on a 10-minute doctor's appointment once per month. Instead, I had more time with a nurse to ask questions."

She credits Khalia for catching a health issue that led to a successful pregnancy and birth. Monique and Khalia worked together for the next two years to ensure a
