Main Street America Gives National Recognition to 22 Main Street Oakland County Communities

- Twelve MSOC communities received accredited status and 10 earned affiliate status.
- The accredited designation is the highest level of recognition, awarded to programs that meet high standards, while the affiliate level honors communities that are making meaningful progress toward those standards.
- MSOC downtowns saw more than \$90 million in new public and private investments, resulting in 100 net new businesses and 560 net new jobs in 2024.

July 30, 2025, Pontiac, Mich. – Twenty-two communities in Main Street Oakland County (MSOC) have earned national recognition from Main Street America for their ongoing work to strengthen and revitalize downtowns through preservation-based economic development and the Main Street program.

Twelve MSOC communities received accredited status: Berkley, Clawson, Farmington, Ferndale, Franklin, Highland, Holly, Ortonville, Oxford, Lake Orion, Rochester and Royal Oak.

Ten others earned affiliate status: Auburn Hills, Birmingham, Clarkston, Hazel Park, Lyon Township/New Hudson, Lathrup Village, Oak Park, Pontiac, South Lyon and Wixom.

"Our Main Street communities are not only preserving their unique historic character, but also creating vibrant destinations for residents and visitors," said Dom Holmes, director of Oakland County Economic Development. "Their success is the direct result of strategic partnerships and grassroots leadership fused with the power of developing a sense of place in our downtowns."

The accredited designation is the highest level of recognition, awarded to programs that meet high standards in areas such as strategic planning, public-private partnerships and organizational sustainability. The affiliate level honors communities that are making meaningful progress toward those standards.

In 2024 alone, MSOC downtowns saw more than \$90 million in new public and private investments, resulting in 100 net new businesses and 560 net new jobs. Additionally, local volunteers contributed more than 23,000 hours of service to support revitalization efforts.

Founded in 2000, Main Street Oakland County is the first and only county-wide Main Street coordinating program in the United States. MSOC supports historic preservation, economic
