- □ CVT Feedback
  - Allow smaller communities to complete larger projects for public facilities
  - Give each community more options when it comes to CDBG Funding that allows for flexibility
  - Reduces CVT's administration burden
- Ensure CVT spending timeliness of CDBG funds
- □ Technology (Neighborly)



# **CDBG Program Changes**

- Allocation of Funds
  - Hybrid
    - Formula Based for Public Service Activities
    - Proposal Based for Public Facilities and all other eligible Activities
    - No Threshold Communities
- Notice of Intent to Apply
- Application
  - Neighborly
- Unspent Funds
  - □ Reprogramming/Recapture



# **CDBG Programming Allocation (Statutory)**

- □ 20% Administrative Cost
- □ 15% Public Services



# **CDBG Programming Allocation**

- □ 35% Home Improvement Program (HIP)
- 5% Down Payment Assistance
- □ 60% to 52 participating communities (PC's)
  - □ Competitive Proposal Process

# **Public Service Allocation**

- 15% CAP on all funds. (Both CVT & County programs)
  - □ The allocation of public service funds to PC's follows the federal CDBG "option one" method from the Housing and Community Development Act, as amended [42 USC 5306(b) (2)].
  - \$3,500 is a minimum award for Public Service



### **Public Facilities**

- Projects
  - Sidewalks
  - Remove Architectural Barries
  - Parks & Recreational Facilities
  - Senior Center
  - Fire Station/Equipment
  - Typically involves
    - Davis Bacon Requirements
    - Environmental Review (CEST/ EA)
    - BABA
    - Section 3 Labor reporting.

- Other
  - Senior Center Access Fees
  - Minor Home Repair
  - Mobile Home repair
  - **■** Code Enforcement

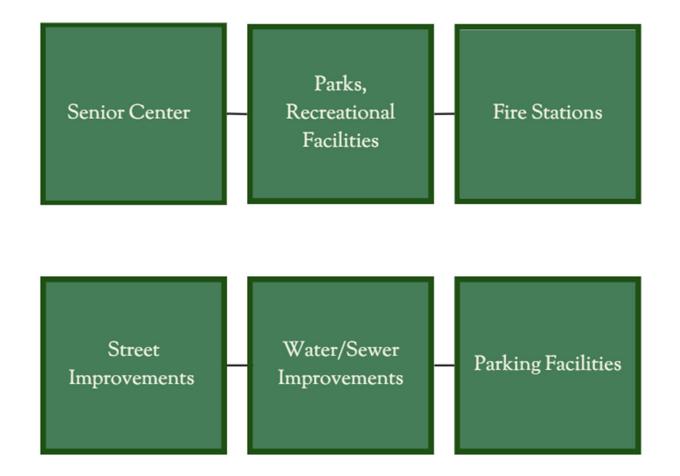

## **Application PY 2026**

- □ Opens after the September 25, 2025, workshop
- Neighborly
  - Access code & password
- □ Due December 5, 2025, 5:00pm
- □ No late applications
  - Will result in no funding for that year.



## 3 Year Cooperation Agreement

- □ Next 3-year Cooperation Agreement covers PY 2027-2029
  - Due summer of 2026
- □ New structure / how this works
  - Urban County Participant
    - Eligible to apply for CDBG funds annually
      - Not required to have CDBG Activities every year
    - Homeowners in your community can apply to the CDBG-funded Home Improvement Program

# **Environmental Review Responsibilities**

- Environmental reviews are due for every activity you apply for
- During environmental review, a project is evaluated for potential environmental impacts to determine whether it meets federal, state and local environmental standards



# **Environmental Review Requirements**

### **Environmental Review**

- Required with the Annual Application
- Required with all reprogramming requests

### One Review Per Project

- If funded in multiple years (must submit each year)
- Do not use the words none, not applicable (N/A) etc.



# SHPO/Section 106 THPO's

- □New guidance on CEST/EA Section 106's
- □If you apply for a public facilities activity, be prepared as soon as you receive approval to hire an architectural historian. SHPO does provide a list of approved people to hire. (next slide)
- □MHR memo states any rehabilitation work done must be sent to SHPO for evaluation before the work can be done.
  - ■Allow 30 days for SHPO to respond
- □Any significant ground disturbance, THPOs will need to be contacted (this is done by the County)
  - ■For PY2025, section 106 checklist must be included with all tier II's and CEST/EA's; we do have to notify all interested THPO's. (July 1, 2025 June 30, 2026)
  - ■30 days must be allowed for THPO's to respond

### SHPO/Section 106 cont...

- □ If you apply for a public facility project, such as
  - Sidewalks
  - Remove Architectural Barriers
  - Parks & Rec Facilities
  - Street Improvements
  - Senior Center non-exempt activities, etc.
- □ You must hire an architectural historian from the SHPO website to complete the section 106 portion of your part 58 ERR.

# ERR - Exempt: Listed in 24 CFR 58.34(a)

### Projects that do not effect environment

(must submit form & maps for each project)

- Code Enforcement
- Technical Assistance
- Public Services (no physical impact)
- Environmental & other planning studies
- Strategic Plans
- Engineering or Design Costs
- · Purchase of tools & insurance



# ERR - Categorically Excluded Subject To: 24 CFR 58.35(a)

### Minimal Effect on Environment

- Acquisition
- Remove Architectural Barriers
- Demolition
- Sidewalks
- Rehabilitation w/out changes of >20%
- Surface with same material w/out changes of >20%

### **Statutory Checklist Required**

**Maps and Documentation** 



# **ERR - Environmentally Assessed**

Non-Exempt or Categorically Excluded Projects must complete a Full EA – Majority of projects do not fall in this category

- May have an effect on the environment
- Residential buildings when density is increased over 4 units or when land use changed
- Water
- Sewer
- Major Rehabilitation
- Most new construction and, reconstruction
- Whenever no exclusion applies
