#### Workgroup Updates

Collaborative Funding: Amanda provided an update on the workgroup's progress. Several council members reported that receiving the weekly funding alerts has been helpful. The weekly emails have alerted them to new funding opportunities, and some have applied as a result. Amanda shared the results from the recent data needs survey. Members reported support is needed around primary data collection and how to better organize their data for story-telling, grant writing efforts, along with outcome and evaluation. Workgroup members will reconvene on strategies to assist membership





**Membership Updates:** Kelsey and Kelly presented the new membership categories. See PowerPoint for details. Members then took a poll to determine what category they might choose today if prompted. Majority of voting members would opt for general membership.

**Other notes**: Eric C. noted that USDA food insecurity data can be overlayed with ACS data to refine communities and/or groups that may be experiencing higher rates of food insecurity (see article). Amanda will confirm with the Health Division's epidemiologist on feasibility.

### Federal and State Policy Updates

- Lauren Marks shared that American Heart Association-Michigan and United Way of Southeastern Michigan are collecting impact stories on the Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP). It is likely funding will not be released and negatively impacting shelters' bed capacity. There may be potential cuts to FEMA which could impact food access during disasters. Email Lauren to receive updates and/or share a story.
- Michigan Healthy School Meals for All was re-added as a categorical line item in the state's budget, but no funding was appropriated. Lori shared Michigan School Nutrition Association has sent action alerts. Without state budget passed, school districts may be preparing two separate budgets. If a statewide budget is not passed before the start of the school year, school districts may need to cut staff and programming.
- Amanda asked the group what the council at-large can do collectively to address the upcoming federal changes to SNAP. For the short-term, members expressed interest in regularly receiving policy updates. They felt the changes can be numerous and fast-paced. It has been hard for some agencies to keep track of these changes, and some are experiencing funding and staffing cuts currently as a result. Council will check in during the September meeting to determine what strategies and activities they can work on together to address the federal changes. Eric C. also believes this will give the Council lead time to review landscape findings and align the two, potentially hosting a summit to highlight and promote the landscape study and address the looming SNAP cuts.
