The MOU allows the County to close the Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) regulators that control flow from the Acacia Park, Birmingham and Bloomfield Village Retention Treatment Basins (RTB) to EFSDS such that they can be closed during wet weather to provide preferential treatment of the sanitary sewage being pumped through the force main from the EFSDS. The agreement requires an annual review of the cost per volume each year.

We have reviewed the calculations to develop the EFSDS credit to each of the three RTB Districts when the regulators are closed giving preference to the EFSDS Flows. The calculation methodologies are outlined in Exhibit A of the agreements. The adopted 2019-2020 cost is \$13.45. After an in-depth review of the cost allocation, it has been determined that the RTB credit for July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021 will be \$10.52 per mcf.

The goal of this project is to proactively continue to complete a PFAS source evaluation that started in 2018 by locating potential PFAS sources outside of the Clinton River Water Resource Recovery Facility (CRWRRF) which may be contributing to the PFAS at CRWRRF in order to stop it at its source. Phase 1 of this work will include identifying known and potential PFAS sources, developing sampling plans, analyzing data collected, and creating a technical memo presenting conclusions.

OHM was contracted and approved to start this work May 21, 2019 (memo attached). Additions to the original scope are on the attached proposal dated August 12, 2020. Additions include:

The U.S. Army Corp of Engineers (USACE) has offered our office the opportunity to capture \$1,165,000 of available funds from previous accounts that are no longer being used. This offer requires a 25 percent match contribution from the GWK Sewage Disposal Fund. At the February 25, 2020 board meeting, you authorized the allocation of \$388,333 of matching funds from that fund.

Since that time, Hubbell, Roth & Clark, Inc (HRC) and the Spicer Group, Inc. (Spicer) have been working with our office to provide documents and exhibits to the USACE, along with updated cost estimates, property records and costs associated with participating in project-scope meetings. Their services have aided in getting this project allocated in a timely manner so it can administered for bidding this fall. For your convenience, I've attached HRC's August 10, 2020 proposal letter for work performed and ongoing work for an amount not to exceed \$11,500.

The Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner's Office has established a collaborative relationship with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) that has provided funding for capital improvement projects saving the County millions of dollars. Annually, the USACE reviews project funding requests from WRC. - 3. Improvements at the 8 Mile SSO chamber, including but not limited to the acquisition, construction, and modification of piping, weirs, gates, and meters.
- 4. The acquisition and construction of other improvements to the Evergreen-Farmington Sewage Disposal System, including sewage retention tanks and associated pumps, piping, and connections.
- 5. Construction of storage facilities within the geographical limits of the Evergreen-Farmington Sewage Disposal System, including, without limitation, a multi-million gallon sewage retention tank on Eight Mile Road in the City of Southfield.

Said drain project is necessary for the public health, and will serve property located entirely within the limits of the City of Auburn Hills, the Village of Beverly Hills, the Village of Bingham Farms, the City of Birmingham, the Charter Township of Bloomfield, the City of Bloomfield Hills, the City of Farmington, the City of Farmington Hills, the Village of Franklin, the City of Keego Harbor, the City of Lathrup Village, the City of Orchard Lake Village, the City of Southfield, the City of Troy and the Charter Township of West Bloomfield (collectively, the "Communities"). The Evergreen-Farmington Sewage Disposal System collects and transports sanitary wastewater originating in the County of Oakland only.

This petition is filed pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 20 of Act No. 40 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1956, as amended.

It is understood and agreed that the entire cost of the drain project, including litigation costs and the amount of any judgment, arbitration award or settlement, to the extent such costs are payable by the Drainage District, is to be assessed against this petitioner and all other public

corporations that benefit from the drain project and contribute to the conditions that make the drain project necessary.

The issuance of bonds to finance the drain project contemplated herein is contingent upon the Communities and the proposed drainage district entering into an agreement as provided by law setting forth the services and operations of the proposed drainage district and to provide for methods of addressing and apportioning future improvements to the proposed drainage district.

RESOLUTION TO PETITION THE DRAINAGE BOARD TO CONVERT THE EVERGREEN-FARMINGTON SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM TO A CHAPTER 20 DRAIN AND INITIATE THE CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN SUBMITTED TO THE STATE OF MICHIGAN BY THE WATER RESOURCES COMMISSIONER

At a regular meeting of the Township Board for the Charter Township of West Bloomfield, Oakland County, Michigan, held on July 13, 2020, at Township Hall, 4550 Walnut Lake Road, West Bloomfield, Michigan, the following preamble and resolution were offered by Trustee Rosenberg, and supported by Trustee Manna:

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Final Order of Abatement drafted in June 2020 between the State of Michigan Department of the Environment, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE), Water Resources Division, and the Charter Township of West Bloomfield, each of the fifteen (15) Oakland County municipalities served by the Evergreen-Farmington Sewage Disposal System (EFSDS), including the Charter Township of West Bloomfield, are required to adopt a Corrective Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Fourth Amended Administrative Consent Order, at the request of the Charter Township of West Bloomfield amends Paragraph 3.1 through 3.5 of the Third Amended Administrative Consent Order to reflect that, even though the Township has completed the actions outlined in the Corrective Action Plan submitted to EGLE in December 2007, the Township remains unable to meet certain capacity requirements and, therefore, additional corrective actions are needed to meet the remedial design standard as defined in EGLE's SSO Policy Guidance dated December 27, 2002; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Fourth Amended Administrative Consent Order, the Township was required to submit to EGLE an approvable long-term corrective action plan to meet the flow capacity agreement between the parties; and

WHEREAS, the proposed long-term corrective action plan proposes to convert the EFSDS from an Act 342 system to a Chapter 20 drain; and

WHEREAS, for the Water Resource Commission to start the process of such conversion, at least two (2) member communities must petition the Drainage Board; and

WHEREAS, the conversion of the EFSDS to a Chapter 20 drain provides substantial benefit to the Township including:

• Governance composed of three (3) elected officials from the County Board of Commissioner's Office and the Water Resource Commissioner;

- Improved transparency and communication through regularly scheduled open public meetings, formal minutes, and formal approval of invoices and contracts by the Drain Board; and
- The ability to conduct public hearings to solicit comments from the communities and the public for all future bond financed projects; and

WHEREAS, the Fourth Amendment to the Administrative Consent Order requests that the Township Board authorize the Township Supervisor to sign same.

THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED that the Township Supervisor is hereby authorized to sign the Fourth Amended Administrative Consent Order attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township hereby adopts the long-term corrective action plan submitted by the Township to the Water Resources Commission on June 23, 2020.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Supervisor and Township Clerk shall sign the Petition attached hereto as Exhibit B which Petition will permit the Water Resources Commission to begin the process of converting the EFSDS to a Chapter 20 Drain and to execute an agreement related to the project contemplated by said Petition and to file the same with the Water Resources Commissioner of the County of Oakland.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Board hereby consents to the assessment of its share of the entire cost of the drain project against the Township.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township agrees that it will pay its share of the costs incurred by the Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner or by the Drainage District in the event the drain or any portion thereof, for any reason, is not constructed.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township acknowledges that the County of Oakland, its Board of Commissioners, and the Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner will not contribute to the cost of the drain project or its operation and maintenance except to the extent that the County of Oakland may be assessed for the cost of the drain project or may agree to contribute to the cost of the drain project in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 20 of Act No. 40 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1956, as amended.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that all prior resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution are hereby rescinded.

FOURTH AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE CONSENT ORDER

The Charter Township of West Bloomfield (Township) owns and operates a separate sanitary sewer system that discharges its sanitary wastewater to the Evergreen-Farmington Sewage Disposal System (EFSDS), which is tributary to the Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA) and Wastewater Resource Recovery Facility (WRRF). In response to the revised Administrative Consent Order (Consent Order), number ACO-04995, with the County of Oakland, on August 14, 2019, the Township requested an amendment to the Third Amended Consent Order, number AFO-SW09-005, entered on March 24, 2009, between the Township and the Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE), Water Resources Division (WRD). AFO-SW09-005, all prior amendments, and all subsequent extension approvals regarding the Township's sanitary sewer system, upon the consent of the parties, and by the authority granted to EGLE by the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, MCL 324.101 et seq., are hereby amended by this Fourth Amended Consent Order as follows:

I. STIPULATIONS

The Township and EGLE stipulate as follows:

1.1 Executive Order 2019-06, signed by Governor Gretchen Whitmer on February 20, 2019, renamed the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) as EGLE effective April 22, 2019. This Consent Order uses EGLE to refer to DEQ prior to April 22, 2019.

- 1.2 The Township negotiated a Town Outlet Capacity (TOC) with the Oakland County Office of the Water Resources Commissioner (County). The TOC is the maximum amount of sanitary wastewater that the Township can discharge to the EFSDS and is 27.41 cubic feet per second. The TOC was first referenced in Final Order of Abatement Number 2100, that was signed in 1988 by the Township, the Michigan Water Resources Commission, and the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.
- 1.3 The Township and the County anticipate replacing the TOC at some time in the future as will be defined in a future contract between the Township and County. If a new contract is entered to replace the TOC, the Township shall submit a copy of the new contract to EGLE. Upon written notification by EGLE to the Township, the new sewage flow capacity, as detailed in the new contract, will be incorporated into this Consent Order by reference and considered the new Flow Capacity. The sewage Flow Capacity in the potential new contract will replace the TOC in this Consent Order and shall be referred to as the "Flow Capacity Agreement" in this Consent Order.
- 1.4 The intent of this Fourth Amended Consent Order is to provide the framework for the Township to comply with the Flow Capacity Agreement and to design and maintain its sanitary sewer system to prevent sanitary sewage overflows (SSOs) resulting from conditions less than the remedial design standard (RDS) as defined in EGLE's 2002 SSO Policy and EGLE's SSO Clarification Statement dated October 23, 2003, that are both described in Paragraph 3.4, below.

III. COMPLIANCE PROGRAM

Paragraphs 3.1 through 3.5 of AFO-SW09-005 and any prior amended Consent Orders are hereby replaced with the following paragraphs:

3.1 The Township completed an evaluation of the feasibility of sanitary sewer projects to remove excess wastewater flow from its sanitary sewer system, and on December 27, 2007, the Township submitted a short-term corrective action plan and schedule to EGLE for approval. The short-term corrective action plan included a detailed description of projects and a schedule for each project to: (a) submit the basis

of design; (b) submit complete plans and specifications; (c) start construction; and (d) complete construction. The Township implemented the approved short-term corrective action plan.

- 3.2 As part of the approved short-term corrective action plan, the Township collected and evaluated flow monitoring data for a period of 12 consecutive months, from January 1, 2012, to December 31, 2012, after it completed the projects specified in the approved plan. Based on its evaluation of the flow monitoring data, the Township determined it cannot meet the TOC and has contributed to downstream SSOs due to capacity issues during events less than the remedial design standard defined in Paragraph 3.4, below. EGLE and the Township have therefore determined that additional corrective actions for the Township's sanitary sewer system are needed.
- 3.3. The Township shall submit an approvable long-term corrective action plan to EGLE for review and approval no later than April 30, 2020, to meet the Flow Capacity Agreement and meet all applicable state and federal law regulating SSOs using as guidance the remedial design standard defined in Paragraph 3.4, below.
- The remedial design standard as defined in EGLE's SSO Policy Guidance dated 3.4. December 27, 2002, is a 25-year, 24-hour storm using growth conditions and normal soil moisture. This remedial design standard will remain the goal of all projects described in this Fourth Amended Consent Order. A ten-year, one-hour storm under dormant and growth conditions will be considered a comparable alternative remedial design standard, as defined in EGLE's SSO Clarification Statement dated October 23, 2003. All SSO events that result from events that exceed this "comparable alternative remedial design To document the standard" will be considered for enforcement discretion. appropriateness of the use of the "comparable alternative remedial design standard," the County submitted a complete report on February 26, 2007. The report contained hydrologic and hydraulic modeling analyses comparing the system response (at the EFSDS outlet and using representative system locations agreed upon by EGLE and the Township) to both the ten-year, one-hour storm under dormant and growth conditions, and the 25-year, 24-hour storm under growth conditions and normal soil moisture.

- On or before **September 1, 2022**, the Township shall submit to EGLE for review and approval, a work plan with implementation schedule for conducting a year-long Project Performance Certification Program (PPC Program) to certify that the **long-term corrective action plan** meets the Flow Capacity Agreement and all applicable state and federal laws regulating SSOs using as guidance the remedial design standard defined in Paragraph 3.4. The Township shall commence and complete the PPC Program work plan in accordance with the EGLE-approved implementation schedule.
- 3.6 The approved **long-term corrective action plan** and the schedules therein shall be incorporated into this Fourth Amended Consent Order by reference and are enforceable hereunder. The Township shall complete all EGLE-approved actions in the long-term corrective action plan by no later than **March 1, 2023**.
- 3.7 On or before March 31, 2024, the Township shall submit to EGLE for review and approval the PPC Program report. If the Township does not certify that the long-term corrective action plan meets the Flow Capacity Agreement and all applicable state and federal laws regulating SSOs using as guidance the remedial design standard defined in Paragraph 3.4, then the Township shall submit an approvable Corrective Action Program work plan to EGLE on or before July 31, 2024.
- 3.8 Progress reports shall be submitted to EGLE beginning upon the entry date of this Fourth Amended Consent Order on an annual basis and shall be due on or before January 15 of each calendar year. The submittal of progress reports shall cease upon termination of this order.
- 3.9 The Township shall submit all reports, work plans, specifications, schedules, or any other writing required by this Section to the WRD, Warren District Office Supervisor, at EGLE, 27700 Donald Court, Warren, Michigan 48092-2793. The cover letter with each submittal shall identify the specific paragraph and requirement of this Fourth Amended Consent Order that the submittal is intended to satisfy.

XII. GENERAL PROVISIONS

All other terms and conditions of AFO-SW09-005 and any previous or subsequent amendments or extensions shall remain in full force and effect and are not altered by this Fourth Amended Consent Order, except as specifically prescribed in this document. The effective date of this Fourth Amended Consent Order shall be the date upon which the Director of the WRD signs this document.
