Letter Proposal - Preparation of SOPs

Dear Mr. Alsaigh:

This letter serves as CDM Smith's proposal to provide professional engineering services involving the preparation of Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for the new biosolids treatment and septage handling facilities recently put into service under the above referenced project at the Clinton River Water Resource Recovery Facility (CRWRRF) that is owned and operated by the Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner (WRC). The new facility employs a thermal hydrolysis process (THP) to pre-treat sludge prior to anaerobic digestion. The product of the digestion process, and after dewatering, is exceptional quality (EQ) biosolids ready for beneficial reuse.

The Biosolids Handling and Septage Receiving Facility Project has four key components: (1) new Biosolids Handling Building, (2) new Covered Biosolids Storage Pad, (3) upgraded Anaerobic Digestion System, and (4) new Septage Receiving Facility. The Biosolids Handling Building consists of a precast paneled, two-story, 15,800-square foot building that houses multiple sludge pumps, sludge screening equipment, pre-THP and post-digestion biosolids dewatering centrifuges, the THP Cambi train, steam boilers, polymer storage/feed, electrical equipment, and instrumentation and controls. In concert with the digesters, this facility generates EQ biosolids that are conveyed to storage. The Covered Biosolids Storage Pad is a new 20,400-square foot concrete storage pad with a standing seam roof to keep the dewatered, EQ biosolids dry, protected from inclement weather, and ready for land application/distribution and marketing. To process pre-treated, THP sludge the Primary and Secondary Digesters have been upgraded consisting of installing new pumped mixing systems in each tank to optimize digestion and a flexible membrane cover on the Secondary Digester to store the biogas prior to reuse. Finally, the new Septage Receiving Facility consists of a brick building that houses septage processing equipment, pumps, electrical, and instrumentation and controls and includes a 54,000-gallon below grade, concrete tank to store highly odorous, organic, and inert material received at the plant.



The upgraded Primary Digester went online in mid-November 2019 along with the sludge blending, screening, pre-dewatering, and THP processes located in the Biosolids Handling Building. In early January 2020, the Secondary Digester, post-dewatering, and cake storage systems went online. The Septage Receiving Facility was ready for operation in early September 2020. The SOPs to be developed by CDM Smith will describe the procedures for startup, operating, and shutdown of the new processes, systems, and equipment at the CRWRRF.

At WRC's request, CDM Smith is providing a Scope of Services and Fee Proposal for professional engineering services in conjunction with the preparation of SOPs for the CRWRRF. The form and scope of this document are based on CDM Smith's understanding of the scope of services, familiarity with the work to be performed, and discussions with WRC staff.

# **Scope of Services**

The Scope of Services consists of the following tasks:

Task 1 – Project Management Including Client and Project Team Communications, Meetings, Workshops, and QA/QC Reviews

## **Task 1A: Project Kickoff Meeting**

CDM Smith will conduct a kickoff meeting (virtual or in-person) immediately after the notice-to-proceed (NTP) is issued by WRC. All stakeholders identified by WRC (e.g., WRC engineering and plant staff) will be invited to attend, along with all key CDM Smith project team members. The purpose of the kickoff meeting is to identify and develop project critical success factors, goals/milestones, responsibilities, and execution of the scope of services. This meeting will be used to confirm the scope of work and answer "big picture" questions from WRC and the project team prior to starting the tasks. In this meeting the proposed list of SOPs and its contents and layout will be reviewed to determine the final SOP format and style. CDM Smith will prepare meeting minutes.

## **Task 1B: Project Management**

This task includes all activities performed by the Project Manager (PM) for project team communications, client communications, project invoicing, project scheduling, project delivery, and other related PM duties throughout the life of the project.

# Task 1C: Project Meetings and Workshops

This task includes all meetings and workshops required to facilitate advancement of the SOPs. Meetings (virtual and/or in-person) will be held to check project status and to perform SOP submittal reviews. Workshops (virtual and/or in-person) will be held to go over findings and to facilitate decisions on outstanding issues. Up to six meetings and up to four workshops will be conducted. CDM Smith will prepare meeting and workshop minutes.



### Task 1D: Quality Assurance/Quality Control (QA/QC) Technical Reviews

QA/QC technical reviews will be performed for each SOP prior to submission to WRC.

### Task 2 - Development of Standard Operating Procedures

CDM Smith will prepare electronic SOPs for the upgraded and new facilities at the CRWRRF. Contractor-submitted equipment data will be collected and assembled in the order of each major system, subsystem, and facility in the project. CDM Smith will add descriptive text to provide clear, concise instructions to conduct a system or equipment startup, operation, and shutdown. Terminology used will coincide with all project and WRC equipment tagging nomenclature. Operating specifications and parameters, preventive and corrective maintenance, troubleshooting, and environmental protection requirements will be discussed (via referencing vendor equipment operation and maintenance (O&M) manuals).

The SOPs will guide and assist plant staff in startup, operating, and shutdown of the equipment. The SOPs will cover the following topics related to the equipment: process principals and objectives; physical description; control description; process control; operational description; troubleshooting; preventative maintenance; safety; and record keeping. Applicable equipment O&M Manuals from the vendors will be incorporated and referenced in each SOP.

# **Task 2A: SOP Development**

CDM Smith will prepare 25 SOPs for the CRWRRF. The development of the 25 SOPs include the following:

- Confirm the list of the SOPs to be developed and the format of the SOPs through the kickoff meeting and subsequent progress meetings with WRC staff. A proposed list of the SOPs to be prepared is presented in the table below.
- Develop the initial draft SOPs for WRC staff review. Development will require input and shadowing of WRC staff where required and will incorporate vendor manual and standard engineering practices where applicable.
- Existing documents that are identified as relevant, design data, and other applicable operational data from construction or plant operations will also be reviewed to capture critical information. Format of the SOPs will utilize any applicable equipment and panel photos, figures, and pertinent screen shots of specific control screens (HMI graphics) used to perform the functions detailed in the specific procedure.
- As it is anticipated that revisions will be needed prior to finalization, CDM Smith will prepare
  the SOPs identified in the table below for submission in draft format for WRC review and
  comment.



• The Fluid Transfer Systems SOPs will consist of piping schematics; figures with tables; appurtenances, isolation, and bypass points called out; and conveyance options noted.

# Task 2B: SOP Development Workshops

At the inception of the SOPs development process and part of the kickoff meeting, the draft list of SOPs included in this proposal will be reviewed. Separate and distinct SOP documents will be developed for the major treatment process areas as individual unit processes. Major process areas, such as the Post-Dewatering System, will have multiple SOPs associated with the general SOP category.

To ensure successful implementation and "buy-in" from the end users of the standard operating procedures proposed for development under this task, CDM Smith proposes that WRC staff participate in collaborative workshops throughout the development process. Suggested attendees shall include CDM Smith's work process analysts/technical specialists/O&M specialists and key WRC plant management and operations' staff.

Upon completion of the SOP development activities, CDM Smith will "shadow" WRC operators to perform validation testing of the effectiveness of the draft SOPs. The findings from the validation testing will be incorporated in the SOPs in order to finalize each document.

#### **Task 2C: SOP Submittals**

CDM Smith will submit draft SOPs (an electronic copy in PDF format and four hard copies each) for WRC review, revise as needed based on WRC comments, and submit the final SOPs (an electronic copy in PDF format and four hard copies each). The SOPs will be submitted in multiple groupings, based on process treatment unit areas, and in accordance with the approved SOP submittal schedule.

The final source files for MS Word, MS Excel, and associated figures and photos in their native format for subsequent use in updates to these SOPs will be provided to WRC. The information will be delivered using a standardized file structure so that the information can be easily located when updates are required. Essentially, the final SOPs will be "living documents".

# **Assumptions and Owner's Responsibilities**

This proposal is based on the following assumptions related to the scope of work and the understanding that WRC will assume the following responsibilities:

- 1. Classroom training services are not included in the scope of work.
- 2. WRC will provide existing plant 0&M Manuals.
- 3. WRC will provide plant operating data and monthly operating reports.
- 4. WRC will provide vendor equipment O&M Manuals.
- 5. WRC will complete reviews and provide comments within two weeks of receipt of all deliverables.



# **Proposed Fee**

WRC will reimburse CDM Smith for execution of the scope of work and supporting expenses described in this letter proposal for a total fee amount not to exceed \$265,570.00, which includes \$8,000 for other direct costs (e.g., airfare, mileage, meals, lodging, and reproduction). This fee is for performing the tasks described above. Contract type and terms and conditions shall comply with the current contract between CDM Smith and WRC. This work will be authorized via an amendment to the current contract.

# **Proposed Schedule**

CDM Smith will complete this work in 7 months from the date of NTP.

#### **Standard of Care**

The standard of care for all professional engineering and related services performed or furnished by CDM Smith will be the care and skill ordinarily used by members of the engineering profession practicing under similar conditions at the same time and in the same locality.

**SUBJECT: Schmid Drain South Pump Station Valve Vault** 

DATE: November 17, 2020

The Oakland County Water Resources Pump Maintenance Unit observed leaking within a valve vault at the Schmid Drain south pump station. Rowe Engineering was the design engineer for the original construction of the drain (established in 1999) and was requested for a proposal to evaluate the leak, to provide recommendations/plans for repair, and to assist with procurement for contractor services. Rowe's services would be completed during the upcoming this winter and would allow staff to procure contracted services to make the necessary repairs.

Recommendation: Authorize Rowe Engineering to proceed per the proposal dated October 9, 2020 as part of their existing as-needed engineering services contact 4869 for engineering services on the Schmid Drain for an estimated cost not-to-exceed \$20,100.

RE: Schmid Drain Pump Station Repair Proposal

Dear Mr. Sandahl:

Thank you for providing ROWE Professional Services Company with the opportunity to submit a proposal for the above referenced project. It is our understanding that an existing ductile iron pipe in the valve vault is leaking and that you would like to have construction documents prepared detailing the repair. Based on our recent visit to the site, we were able to observe the leak under pressure and further understand the issues in making the repairs. The spool piece of pipe is leaking at the flange and is located on the outlet side of the pump. The pipe outlet is submerged in Sylvan Lake and there are no valves between the leak and the outlet in the lake to prevent water from flowing back into the valve vault. Based on discussions with staff, we will provide options and construction documents for the chosen option to repair the pipe.

#### Work Plan/Fee

ROWE will utilize existing as-built drawings to develop repair options for the leaking pipe. Two possible options discussed in the field were to place a plug over the outlet in the lake to stop the backflow of water or allow the water to fill the valve vault and then the contractor would need to replace the pipe using underwater techniques. We will present the options along with opinions of probable repair costs for review and approval of one of the options. Once an option has been selected, we will prepare construction plans and specifications for the chosen option to provide to your as needed contractors for bidding. Based on our conversation, we will add an alternate for the installation of a valve between the valve vault and the outlet to address any future maintenance concerns. We have included a survey allowance to cover any costs of any survey work required for the installation of a valve. The fee does not include preparation of formal bidding documents.

We recognize that this repair needs to be accomplished as soon as possible and during the winter months when the lake level has been lowered. ROWE is prepared to begin working on the project within two weeks of receiving authorization to proceed. We anticipate presenting preliminary repair options approximately four weeks after commencement and delivering final plans by January 15, 2021.

We propose to complete the work described for the following estimated fees:

Preliminary Repair Options \$6,400.00 Construction Drawings and Specifications \$9,500.00 Survey Allowance \$4,200.00 Mr. Drew Sandahl October 9, 2020 Page 2

The scope of work is limited to the tasks presented above which include replacement of the pipe and possibly installation of a new valve. The scope of work does not include the following:

- 1. Soil borings or geotechnical evaluation.
- 2. Preparation of any permits required for the project.
- 3. Attendance at a pre-bid meeting.
- 4. Assistance during construction. ROWE can be available to provide these services on a time and materials basis if desired.
- 5. Preparation of as-constructed drawings.
