**SUBJECT: Three Existing Billboard Leases** 

**DATE:** December 15, 2020

When the Clinton River Water Resources Recovery Facility Drainage District became the owner of the City of Pontiac wastewater treatment plant and its associated property, it became the landlord for several existing leases between the city and various private companies. Most of those original leases have since expired and have been replaced with new leases containing terms, conditions, and rates more favorable to the drainage district. Three leases, however, have not yet expired and continue with the same terms, conditions, and rates as originally adopted approximately 15 years ago.

Although these three leases are separate and distinct, their terms, conditions, rates, and tenant, Outfront Media, LLC., are identical. Each lease involves a single outdoor advertising structure, i.e. a billboard.

The lease rate for each billboard property has been on a graduated scale with an increase of \$1,000 per year reaching its current rate of \$21,000 apiece per year.

Outfront Media has proposed entering into three new 10-year agreements at the same \$21,000 apiece rate but with smaller increases of \$300 per year. It cites the coronavirus pandemic and various other reasons for the proposed lower rate of increases.

Lacking expertise in this somewhat esoteric exercise, staff requests the Board retain the services of Cushman & Wakefield, a firm with considerable experience working with other Oakland County departments, at a cost of not less than \$5,000 nor more than \$9,000 to develop an appraisal for all three lease properties. The appraisal will be in accordance with the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice, and the Code of Ethics and Certification Standards, and will provide staff with a determination of the fair market value of the property when used for outdoor advertising structures, and a written report within 45 days of its engagement.

Requested Action: Retain Cushman & Wakefield to appraise the property and provide current market value(s) to be used for outdoor advertising structures at a cost of not less than \$5,000 nor more than \$9,000 and prepare a written report within 45 days of its engagement.

SUBJECT: CRWRRF - Biodrying Study

**DATE:** December 15, 2020

The Clinton River Water Resource Recovery Facility (CRWRRF) currently produces approximately 14,000 wet tons per year of 32% TS Class A dewatered biosolids cake. This product is being land applied at a cost of \$50 per ton or approximately \$700,000 annually. In an effort to reduce the land application cost, Jacobs submitted a proposal (copy attached) to conduct a demonstration study within the existing biosolids storage building to evaluate the potential for biodrying of dewatered cake at 60%. This has the potential to reduce the biosolids cake produced to around 8,000 tons annually, which would result in a savings of approximately \$300,000 annually and develop other possible uses for the biosolids product that could reduce product management and land application costs.

The Jacobs' pilot project evaluation includes planning, design, start-up, monitoring, testing, project management, quality control and final report. The cost from Jacobs to complete this study is \$39,000. WRC work includes procuring and setting up equipment, pile construction, and all operation and sampling test costs. WRC costs are expected to total to \$10,000. The total cost to perform this study is \$49,000. This total does not include any potential future construction or design costs.

We recommend proceeding with the Biodrying Study with Jacobs (CH2M).

### **Additional Professional Services**

#### Dear Razik:

I am writing at your request to outline the additional services performed by Fishbeck during the design and construction of the renovation and addition to the Clinton River Water Resources Recovery Facility Administration Building.

Our team had incorporated the desired layout for the lab which had been provided to us by the Water Resources lab team. That design utilized the existing rooms for the Lab (Room 131), Drinking Water Chemist (Room 132), and Samples (Room 133). The requested revised design is shown on the attached 60% Construction Drawing submission dated January 15, 2019. Shortly after this meeting, we were informed that the lab was to change to be a full service lab, and a new design was presented to us. That design expanded the Lab 131 to the front wall, and created smaller rooms for the Drinking Water Chemist 132, and Samples 133. This required removing a load bearing wall, and reworking the information on the architectural, structural, mechanical, and electrical engineering drawings. The requested revised design is shown on the attached 90% Construction Drawing submission dated February 18, 2019 attached. The professional fees associated with these changes total Eleven Thousand Nine Hundred Two Dollars (\$11,902.00).

During the removal and replacement of the parking lot, it was discovered that the sub-soil conditions west of the building were not suitable for the installation of the new parking lot surface. Our civil team provided a design to address this unknown condition consisting of installing a 6" underdrain set in 6A stone to drain off the excess water in the soils, and installing a Tensar geogrid to stabilize the soils to allow the installation the parking lot. This design is shown on the attached response to RFI 33. The professional fees associated with these changes total Nine Hundred Forty Dollars (\$940.00).





## **EASEMENT USE AGREEMENT**

## WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Owner is the owner of certain property as tenants by the entirety, said property being more particularly described as:

The West 1/2 of Lot 12, all of Lots 13 and 14, and the East 90 feet of Lot 15 of **BLOOMFIELD HILLS RESEARCH INDUSTRJAL PARK** according to the plat thereof recorded in Liber 183 of Plats, Pages 14, 15, 16 and 17 of Oakland County Records.

Commonly known as: 329 Enterprise Court, Bloomfield Hills, Michigan 48302

Tax Parcel No. 19-04-351-042

WHEREAS, there is located over said property permanent easement for storm drainage purposes, said easement having been granted to the "District" as recorded in Liber 7023, pages 292-297, Oakland County Records; and,

WHEREAS, Owner acknowledges and accepts the rights of the District in permanently maintaining control and usage of said easement; and

WHEREAS, Owner desires to construct a concrete dumpster pad, brick texture poured concrete dumpster/screen wall, wooden gates and related appurtenances hereinafter referred to as the "Improvements" within said easement; and

WHEREAS, the District does not object to the placement of said Improvements within the easement(s) as approved at its Board meeting

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and covenants and undertakings hereinafter contained, and for ONE DOLLAR (\$1.00), receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, Owner and District mutually agree as follows:

- 1) Owner shall be allowed to construct and maintain the Improvements within said easement as depicted in the attached site plan prepared by Fenn & Associates, Inc, Job No. C20-024.O2X, dated September 17, 2020 and approved by the District. Said Improvements to be used for Owner's purposes, and shall further be subject to the following conditions:
  - a) **Owner** shall not change or modify the **Improvements** located within the easement without prior approval from the **District**.
  - b) **Owner** shall notify the **District** 48 hours prior to construction to arrange inspection as may be necessary.
  - c) Owner shall obtain a permit from the District for said construction.
  - d) Owner shall not change the grade within the easement to interfere with or impede the flow of surface drainage.
  - e) **Owner** shall have the limits of the easement staked by a qualified surveyor prior to construction.
- 2) The **Improvements** and all related appurtenances shall be subject to the paramount rights of the **District**.
- 3) Except as permitted by this agreement, the **Owner** shall not build or convey to others permission to build any permanent structures in or on the easement area. As used herein, the term "**permanent structures**" shall include, by way of example but not limitation, buildings, additions, retaining walls or other

structures which require footings or structures that impair, obstruct, or adversely affect the rights of the **District** under said easement. Notwithstanding anything else contained herein, in the event it becomes necessary for the **District**, its agents or assigns to maintain, operate, repair, clean, enlarge, relocate, or otherwise improve the drainage system, and in doing so it requires the removal disassembly, disturbance or destruction of the **Improvements** located within the easement, the **Owner** shall be solely responsible for any increased costs to the **District** and all costs associated with the restoration of said **Improvements**.

- 4) **Owner** shall indemnify the **District** against, and shall forever hold the **District** harmless from, any and all losses, liability, actions, claims, demands, costs, expenses, injuries or damages of any kind whatsoever which may be brought or made which shall be caused by or arise out of any use of the easement by **Owners**, employees, contractors, guests, visitors, invitees, licensees, and any other person coming upon the premises.
  - 5) Owner shall acknowledge and further hold harmless the District for any and all costs and expenses incurred in and arising out of any use of the easement for any of the purposes legally allowed arising out of the existence of said easement.
  - 6) **Owner** shall be responsible for any damage to **District's** facility due to construction or future use of the **Improvements**.
  - 7) Prior to the Effective Date of this agreement and continuing for the duration of construction of the **Improvements**, **Owner** shall obtain and maintain General Liability Insurance with minimum limits of \$500,000 per occurrence and \$500,000 dollars aggregate protecting the **District** from any and all claims arising from the construction of the **Improvements**. The **Owner** will provide proof of insurance to **District**.
  - 8) Owner and/or its contractor shall be responsible for and obtain any permits, approvals or clearances as may be required from federal, state or local authorities, the public utilities and private property owners.



**DATE:** December 15, 2020

The Oakland County Water Resources Pump Maintenance Unit observed leaking within a valve vault at the Schmid Drain south pump station. Rowe Engineering was the design engineer for the original construction of the drain (established in 1999) and was requested for a proposal to evaluate the leak, to provide recommendations/plans for repair, and to assist with procurement for contractor services. Rowe's services would be completed during the upcoming winter and spring, and would allow staff to procure contracted services to make the necessary repairs.

At the November 17, 2020 meeting of the Schmid Drain Drainage Board, the board tabled the October 9, 2020 proposal from Rowe Engineering. The tabling was requested by the City of Keego Harbor. Staff has received a modified proposal from Rowe Engineering to better separate design services from construction phase services. This authorization would allow Rowe Engineering to proceed with the evaluation and recommendation portion of the engineering work. Additional services will be required during the project portion of the work, which will be part of a separate board authorization.

Recommendation: Decline the tabled Rowe Engineering proposal dated October 9, 2020, and Authorize Rowe Engineering to proceed per the proposal dated December 2, 2020 as part of their existing as-needed engineering services contact 4869 for engineering services on the Schmid Drain.

Dear Mr. Sandahl:

Thank you for providing ROWE Professional Services Company with the opportunity to submit a proposal for the above referenced project. It is our understanding that an existing ductile iron pipe in the valve vault is leaking and that you would like to have construction documents prepared detailing the repair. Based on our recent visit to the site, we were able to observe the leak under pressure and further understand the issues in making the repairs. The spool piece of pipe is leaking at the flange and is located on the outlet side of the pump. The pipe outlet is submerged in Sylvan Lake and there are no valves between the leak and the outlet in the lake to prevent water from flowing back into the valve vault. Based on discussions with staff, we will provide options and construction documents for the chosen option to repair the pipe.

#### Work Plan/Fee

ROWE will utilize existing as-built drawings to prepare construction plans and specifications to provide to your as-needed contractors for bidding. Based on our conversation, we will add an alternate for the installation of a valve between the valve vault and the outlet to address any future maintenance concerns. The fee does not include preparation of formal bidding documents.

We recognize that this repair needs to be accomplished as soon as possible and during the winter months when the lake level has been lowered. ROWE is prepared to begin working on the project within two weeks of receiving authorization to proceed. Assuming a notice to proceed by December 15, 2020, we anticipate delivering final plans by January 31, 2021.

We propose to complete the work described for the following estimated fees:

Construction Drawings and Specifications \$9,500.00

The scope of work is limited to the tasks presented above which include replacement of the pipe and possibly installation of a new valve. The scope of work does not include the following:

- 1. Soil borings or geotechnical evaluation.
- 2. Conducting additional research or developing cost estimates for options.
- 3. Topographical or boundary survey.
- 4. Preparation of any permits required for the project.
- 5. Attendance at a pre-bid meeting.
- 6. Assistance during construction. ROWE can be available to provide these services on a time and materials basis if desired.
- 7. Preparation of as-constructed drawings.

This memo accompanies the attached Engineering Services Agreement between Fishbeck and the Evergreen Farmington Sanitary Drain Drainage District. The design of this project will address portions of the items in the Final Order of Determination. These items include improvements to the 8 Mile Pump Station; lining of the 60-inch Sewer, construction of a new18-inch gravity sewer and modifications to the 8 Mile SSO Chamber. In general, this project will increase the throughput capacity of the 8 Mile Pump Station to allow more flow to reach the Evergreen Farmington Drain system discharge point into the GLWA system. A further explanation of the project is shown below:

#### Design Phase

- 1. Construct a new approximately 4,800 foot, 18-inch diameter gravity sewer downstream of the 8 Mile Pump Station. All the laterals and sewers currently connected to the 60-inch diameter sewer along this reach of the sewer will be connected to this new sewer. The sewer will connect back into the system upstream of the 8 Mile Pump Station. This will allow a higher hydraulic grade line to be used downstream of the 8 Mile Pump Station.
- 2. Slip line approximately 3,800 feet of the existing 60-inch Sewer, downstream of the 8 Mile Pump Station along 8 Mile Road with a 54-inch inside diameter material. The new sewer will be able to handle increased internal pressures caused by the higher hydraulic grade line.
- 3. Modify the 8 Mile SSO Chamber by raising the weir wall and making modifications to the emergency sluice and slide grates.
- 4. Upgrade Pump No. 3 and replace Pump No. 4 at the 8 Mile Pump Station to allow bypass pumping of flow through the existing 30-inch force main. The bypassing is required to allow the slip lining to occur in the 60-inch Sewer

### **Bidding Phase**

Fishbeck will assist WRC during the bidding stage. These tasks will include but are not limited
to conducting a pre-bid meeting and issuing meeting minutes; responding to contractor
questions during the bidding process; preparing necessary addenda; assisting WRC staff in
reviewing bids, bid tabulations and references and providing a recommendation of award
letter.

Fishbeck already developed the Basis of Design for this project. The executive summary is included with this memo for your review. The design phase of this project will take approximately one year.

#### 1. DOCUMENTS CONSTITUTING THE AGREEMENT

The Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner Engineering Services Agreement Standard Terms and Conditions (DC-391 Part B) attached hereto are incorporated into this Agreement by reference. This Agreement is the entire and integrated contract between the Owner and the Engineer and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, whether written or oral. The Engineer's proposal is included as part of the Agreement for reference. The Agreement may only be amended by Engineering Work Orders that have been properly executed by the parties.

#### 2. PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

The Owner owns, operates, and maintains the Evergreen Farmington Sanitary Drain Drainage District ("EFSDDD"). The Owner needs to increase the outlet capacity of the EFSDD into the Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA), and therefore is developing the 8 Mile Road Conveyance (the "Project"), which shall, in general, consist of the following:

- **2.1.** The project will require bypassing the flow around the 8 Mile Pump Station (8M PS) during construction. The existing 30-inch force main from the 8M PS to the Evergreen Interceptor will be utilized for bypassing flow. The existing Pump No. 3 will be modified to increase the pump capacity to 30 cfs. Pump No. 4 will be replaced to increase the pump capacity to 30 cfs. The combined capacity for both pumps will be 40 cfs through the 30-inch force main. The increased pump capacity will require improvements to the electrical service, power distribution, and standby power systems to support the pump upgrades at the 8M PS.
- **2.2.** The existing 60-inch Sewer downstream of the 8M PS will be slip lined with a 54-inch nominal inside diameter material. The estimated length of slip lining will be approximately 3,800 feet. This will allow an increase in the discharge flow from the 8M PS.
- **2.3.** The tributary sewers and laterals connected to the existing 60-inch Sewer will be connected to a new 18-inch local tributary sewer along 8 Mile Road to hydraulically separate the tributary connections downstream of the 8 Mile Pump Station. The length of the sewer will be approximately 4,800 feet long. This will require additional easements to be procured as part of this project.
- **2.4.** The existing septage unloading facility adjacent to the 8M PS will be connect to both the proposed slip lined 60" Sewer as well as the 18" local tributary collector sewer. A three-way plug valve will control the discharge point with typical flow diverted to the slip lined 60-inch Sewer. A level sensor will be installed in the slip lined 60-inch sewer and when the water level inside the pipe approaches full it will signal the three-way valve to move and divert flow to the pump station via the collector sewer.
- 2.5. The weir at the Evergreen Emergency SSO Chamber needs to be raised by

approximately 5 feet. This will require removal and reconstruction of the existing monitoring chamber above the overflow portion of the structure. This will require significant traffic control along 8 Mile Road with the potential construction of an additional lane along westbound 8 Mile Road. In addition, improvements will be made to the existing slide and sluice gates to provide additional emergency SSO relieve.

#### 3. PROJECT-SPECIFIC SERVICES

In addition to the standard services required by the Evergreen Farmington Sanitary Drain Drainage District Engineering Services Agreement Standard Terms and Conditions, the Engineer shall provide the Project-Specific services listed below. The Owner may authorize the Engineer to provide Additional Special Services by Engineering Work Order during the Project.

#### 3.1. Design Phase

- **3.1.1.** The Project-Specific services consist of:
- **3.1.2.1.** Complete 3D scanning of the interior of the 8M PS and develop a BIM model for construction documents.
- **3.1.2.2.** Assist WRC staff in performing draw down flow test for each of the existing five pumps at the 8M PS at different conditions to better determine the existing pump characteristics.
- **3.1.2.3.** Perform additional topographical survey of 8 Mile Road from the end of the slip lining to the end of the proposed tributary sewer.
- **3.1.2.4.** Survey the existing sewer connections along the proposed tributary sewer collector route and other additional connections upstream of the Evergreen Emergency SSO chamber to verify the proposed sewer and overflow weir elevations. This will be used to confirm the final proposed elevation of the collector sewer.
- **3.1.2.5.** Evaluate the existing 8 Mile Pump Station electrical service, power distribution system, and standby power (generator) system and assess its capacity to perform under the proposed operating scenarios and sequences. New Pump No. 3 and 4 will be evaluated for operation on a portable generator. Manual transfer switches and connections provision will be included if applicable.
- **3.1.2.6.** Conduct virtual workshop to discuss slip lining materials to include in specifications.
- **3.1.2.7.** Develop 30% construction documents for confirmation of concepts, perform internal quality acceptance/quality control (QA/QC), then meet with WRC staff to review. Incorporate WRC comments into the construction documents.
- **3.1.2.8.** Evaluate the feasibility of replacing existing Pump No. 4 with a dry pit submersible pump.
- **3.1.2.9.** Complete a structural dynamic (harmonic frequency) analysis to evaluate impacts of modifying the existing pump operating speeds on the 8 Mile Pump Station building.

- **3.1.2.10.** Analyze if a magnetic flow meter can be installed in the new chamber downstream of the 8M PS.
- **3.1.2.11.** Identify required temporary and permanent easements and provide WRC staff with easement sketches.
- **3.1.2.12.** Develop 60% construction documents and cost opinion, perform internal QA/QC, then meet with WRC staff to review. Incorporate WRC comments into the construction documents.
- **3.1.2.13.** Prepare permit applications, as necessary, on behalf of WRC. Set up and conduct meetings with individual agencies as needed (City of Southfield, MDOT, EGLE).
- **3.1.2.14.** Submit applications and construction plans for permit approvals.
- **3.1.2.15.** Submit plans to utility agencies for review.
- **3.1.2.16.** Develop project specifications in accordance with WRC standards.
- **3.1.2.17.** Develop 90% construction documents and cost opinion, perform internal QA/QC, then meet with WRC staff to review. Incorporate WRC comments into the construction documents.
- **3.1.2.18.** Provide Engineer's Estimate of Probable Construction Costs.
- **3.1.2.19.** Provide final (100%) construction documents.
- **3.1.2.20.** Fishbeck will have one kickoff meeting, 10 progress meeting and provides additional hours for miscellaneous meetings throughout the project. Fishbeck will provide the Owner an agenda and meeting meetings for each meeting.
- **3.1.2.21.** Fishbeck will evaluate the existing building to see if it meets the National Fire Protection Association 820 code requirements.
- **3.1.2.22.** Perform seven test borings at the approximate locations shown on the attached FKE Engineering Associates proposal. These borings will supplement the investigation conducted as part of the Basis of Design (BOD). Two test borings will be drilled to 35 feet, three borings will be drilled to 30 feet and two borings will be drilled to 25 feet. Test borings will be drilled under the supervision of a field engineer who will direct all drilling operations, record soil and groundwater information, and to modify drilling operations as required to obtain the necessary field information. Samples will be collected at regular depth intervals using the Standard Penetration Test (SPT) method. A ROW permit will be obtained from the MDOT to drill along the 8 Mile Road Right of Way. A lane closure will be required to drill the test borings.
- **3.1.2.23.** Laboratory testing will be conducted on representative samples taken from the borings to assist in the evaluation of the subsurface conditions. Testing will, at a minimum, consist of determining the moisture content, dry density, and unconfined compressive strength tests.

**3.1.2.24.** The geotechnical investigation report will summarize findings and investigation procedures including recommendations and evaluations as they relate to the proposed project. This includes evaluations and recommendations for directional drilling construction methods, temporary earth retention system(s) (TERS). The report will include test boring logs, location plan, and results of laboratory testing.

#### 3.2. Bidding Phase

Fishbeck will assist WRC with the following during the bidding stage of the project:
