June 15, 2022

A meeting of the Drainage Board for the Red Run Intercounty Drain was held at the office of the Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner, Public Works Building, Building 95 West, Waterford, Michigan and via Microsoft Teams on June 15, 2022.

Present:

Michael Gregg, Chairperson and Deputy for Gary McDowell, Director of the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development; Brian Baker for Candice Miller, Member and Macomb County Public Works Commissioner; and Anne Vaara, Chief Deputy for Jim Nash, Secretary and Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner.

Also Present: Representing the office of the Macomb County Public Works Commissioner Jeff Bednar. Representing the office of the Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner: George Nichols, Meg Koss, and Stephanie Lajdziak. Others in attendance: Jamie Burton and Nancy Kolinski (Hubbell, Roth & Clark)

Chairperson Gregg called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m.

4. Public Comment.

5. Freedom Hill.

Nancy Kolinski provided an update on the status of the Freedom Hill project. She advised that L.J. Construction expects the project to be completed by July 5th. Anne Vaara voiced her concern with rushing the plantings and possible damage due to the heat. Jamie Burton and Ms. Kolinski agreed and stated that this concern was also brought up at their status meeting with the contractors. HRC was assured that the plantings were under warranty and watering is part of L.J. Construction's services.

- 5b. Ms. Kolinski gave the Board an update on the supplemental services for construction projects that are ongoing. She advised the Board that the 408 certification for the Freedom Hill project is ongoing due to supplemental information requested from the Army Corps of Engineers. She furthered stating they are aware the project will be completed before the 408 certification is granted. The George W. Kuhn (GWK) Headwaters notice has been closed and the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) is currently working on their permit reviews. She concluded stating the South Bank project is under contract with AEI, which completed a topography survey. Reports of this survey will be presented to the Board when available.
- 5c. Ms. Kolinski provided a brief update on the sediment testing that is required along the GWK Headwaters project due to the volume of soil being removed and the related impact on wildlife and the surrounding habitat. The results are currently being reviewed. The Army Corps of Engineers and EGLE will provide direction once reports on the testing results and associated recommendations are completed. Mr. Burton furthered that once the reports are released, HRC will present the Board with a more informed course of action regarding the sediment.

6. Construction Estimate

Construction Estimate No. 3 for L.J. Construction in the amount of \$157,909.25 was presented. It was moved by Vaara, supported by Baker, to approve Construction Estimate No. 3 in the amount of \$157,909.25 as presented.
