Call to order at 10:00 A.M., at the corner of Baldwin and Davison Lake Roads, then moved to drain sight just west of Baldwin Road on Davison Lake Road north side of road.

Discussion of brushing and spraying. The brush has been pretty much cleared by the landowner on the Lapeer County side and Mr. Nicklas is planning to clear the brush on the Oakland County side, on his property.

Motion by Seames, seconded by Snyder that the Lapeer County drain office will furnish the spike, and that the landowner Mr. Norm Nicklas will apply. The cost is to be split between Oakland and Lapeer Counties at 60% Oakland and 40% Lapeer.

Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Norm Nicklas is to send this office a letter releasing the drainage district and the inter-county drain board of any responsibility as well as liability for the spreading of the spike.

Mr. Norm Nicklas is to notify the neighbors downstream at least 10 days prior to the spreading of the spike. Two (2) downstream neighbors having animals.

Mr. Norm Nicklas is also to send the Lapeer County Drain Commissioner a letter stating the number of rods to be treated with spike for the purpose of ordering spike.

No further business to come before this board for discussion.

SUBJECT: Weir Drain Maintenance

DATE: July 21, 2022

The Weir Drain was inspected in 2015 and the inspection yielded approximately \$5,000 worth of repairs. The repairs primarily consisted of downed tree removals. The drain was inspected again in 2018 and yielded approximately \$700 worth of repairs that consisted of removing downed trees. An inspection is scheduled for 2022 and is estimated to cost \$2,000.

One operational complaint was received in April 2022 and warranted beaver dam removal and several trips to the site to trap. The total cost of the effort was approximately \$1,400.

The maintenance account has a deficit balance of (\$9,557) as of March 31, 2022. The assessment length of the drain is two miles. The drain is apportioned to Oakland County 60% and to Lapeer County 40%.

Requested Actions:

Authorize the Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner to perform the inspection and necessary maintenance (as limited by the Michigan Drain Code) for 2023.

Approve an assessment of \$5,000 for 2023.
