ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2022-02

RESCINDS ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2020-02.

This order is issued in accordance with Michigan Supreme Court Administrative Order 2001-1.

IT IS ORDERED:

- 1. No weapons are allowed on the premises of the 52nd District Courts. As used in this Order, "premises" includes all areas within the exterior walls of a court building, including but not limited to all entry vestibules. Premises also includes the outside curtilage of a court building, all walkways to court building entrances, all designated nonpublic areas used by court staff (e.g., staff parking areas), and all areas where a judge conducts an event concerning a court case. This prohibition does not apply to law enforcement officers in the performance of their official duties only. Officers appearing at the 52nd District Courts on a personal matter may not carry a weapon or wear their uniform on the premises. The Chief Judge may authorize exceptions in extraordinary circumstances.
- 2. Except as provided in paragraph 1 above, all persons and their belongings and all parcels are subject to screening by the Oakland County Sheriff's Deputies for the purposes of keeping weapons and other restricted items from entering the facility.
 - If at any time there is an articulable and reasonable suspicion that a weapon may be found, a person or object is subject to search. The search shall be no more intrusive than necessary to protect against the dangers presented.
- 3. Notice shall be posted that "No weapons are permitted on the premises of the 52nd District Courts. All persons and property are subject to a search for weapons and restricted items as a condition of entry. Persons in violation of this order may be held in contempt of court."

4. Officers providing security for the 52nd District Courts may temporarily detain a person suspected of violating this Order, and may seize any weapons found, for purposes of investigating and enforcing this Order.
