The number of reported cases decreased by 104 cases. The average number of tests per day decreased by 95 tests per day. Percent positivity decreased .8% over the last 28 days and decreased by .1% over the last 7 days. The number of deaths reported during this period has increased by .69%. The percentage of cases hospitalized has decreased by .3%. All age groups experienced decreases in case counts. Healthcare capacity in many places is still at or nearing capacity. Testing, tracing, containment and infrastructure remain stable.
