The number of reported cases increased by 358 cases. The average number of tests per day increased by 121 tests. Percent positivity increased .7% over the last 28 days and increased 1.0% over the last 7 days. Deaths have decreased for this reporting period. The percentage of cases hospitalized has decreased by 2.0%. All age groups experienced increases in case counts except for the 90+ age group, which has remained stable. Healthcare capacity in many places is still at or nearing capacity. Testing, tracing, containment and infrastructure remain stable.
