The number of reported cases increased by 96 cases. The average number of tests per day increased by 246 tests. Percent positivity increased .04% over the last 28 days and increased .13% over the last 7 days. Deaths increased by .29% for this reporting period. The percentage of cases hospitalized has decreased by .29%. There was a decrease in the 0-4, 19-29, 50-59, 70-79, and 80-89 age groups and an increase in the 5-9, 10-13, 14-18, 30-39, and 60-69 age groups. There were two age groups who did not see change in trends, 40-49 and 90+. Healthcare capacity in many places is still at or nearing capacity. Testing, tracing, containment and infrastructure remain stable.
