The number of reported cases decreased by 1811 cases. The average number of tests per day decreased by 420 tests. Percent positivity decreased 6.84% over the last 28 days and decreased 4.58% over the last 7 days. Deaths increased by .43% for this reporting period. The percentage of cases hospitalized increased by .21%. There was a decrease in cases observed for all age groups. Healthcare capacity in many places is still at or nearing capacity with a range of 42-99%. Testing, tracing, containment and infrastructure remain stable.
