The number of reported cases decreased by 363 cases. The average number of tests per day decreased by 147 tests. Percent positivity decreased 2.37% over the last 28 days and decreased .39% over the last 7 days. Deaths increased by .07% for this reporting period. The percentage of cases hospitalized was the same as the previous reporting period. There was an increase in cases observed in the 10–13-year-old age group and a decrease in cases observed for all other age groups. Healthcare capacity in many places is still at or nearing capacity with a range of 47-99%. Testing, tracing, containment and infrastructure remain stable.
